Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11 THERE GOES THE NEIGHBORHOOD

Where you live determines how you live. If you live in an apartment, you have to be mindful of your neighbors. If you share a homeowners' association, you have to follow its rules. Even if you have a private home in a gated community, you have to pay taxes and keep up with the bills.

Where do you live? No, not your address. Not the apartment number. Not your street or neighborhood. Not the town you chose because of its beauty or proximity to work. Where do you live? You live with Christ.

The Letter to the Colossians calls Christian brothers and sisters those who "were raised with Christ." And it tells them, in a beautiful phrase, where they live: "Your life is hidden with Christ in God."

Because we were raised with Christ, we live above, and we should seek the things that pertain to life above, not to life below. "Think of what is above, not of what is on earth."

We have a classy address. We live with Christ in God. Where we live determines how we live. We put aside the wants of the earth: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed. We adopt the way of freedom and unity. It's good for the neighborhood.

We are hidden with Christ in God. We are so close to Christ, that when he, our life, appears, we will appear with him in glory.

ORDINARY TIME is the part of the liturgical calendar that falls outside the major seasons such as Advent, Epiphany, Lent, and Easter. It is the time when we focus on the things Jesus said and did throughout his time on earth, rather than on the major events of His life.

Most of the days in our own lives are happily ordinary as well. They are times filled with the ordinary love and hope and fear of daily life.

The liturgical color of ORDINARY TIME is green, which symbolizes growth. This is a time when we explore what it means to live daily in faith, a time of growth as we explore everyday sacredness.

USING OUR TIME WISELY. A jar of honey lasts practically forever. The oldest jar of honey ever discovered was over five thousand years old. Honey is very different from market-fresh produce, then; because most fruits and vegetables last only a few days, we treat them carefully. At this time of summer, we rush to find recipes for cherries and beans so we don't waste even one.

We wouldn't feel that same urgency about honey.

In our own way, we are as delightful and fragile as ripe produce.

Today's readings urge us not to spoil, but to make good use of our time on earth. Ecclesiastes reminds us that because God provides for us now and always, we can manage our daily affairs without anxiety.



Saint Paul encourages the Colossians to keep thoughts of heaven in everything they do, and Jesus himself asks us to treasure not earthly wealth, but God alone.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION. Apart from the period from arabic Rite and the Arab language, Thanksgiving through Christmas, summer is a favored time for family reunions. We trace family trees and recall our origins.

Worship has a family tree as well, and the way we celebrate our foundational faith today has been influenced by various styles and customs through the centuries.

We are Western Christians of the Latin Rite, but there are other ritual families as well. The Archdiocese of Milan in Italy follows the Ambrosian Rite, Toledo in Spain preserves the Mozand Lyons in France is home to the Gallican Rite.

DIVERSI Isn't the Catholic Church the same everywhere? Not at all. It never has been!

The existence of so many liturgical families reminds us that unity, not uniformity, is what the Church seeks to achieve among her children. We are united in faith, but wonderfully diverse in rituals, ceremonies, languages, customs, and spirituality.

COVER PHOTO: As I continue my seemingly NEVER-ENDING research into the early history of Catholicism in the lewel of the Yough I have made contact with descendants of John McGrath, one of the first and most prominent Catholic residents of Connellsville. Ellie Lieb, his last DIRECT descendant (at least as far as I can ascertain), left town a few years ago and moved to Montana. As I sought to connect others to him, descendants I assumed to be nieces/ nephews (with a few "greats" preceding) I eventually was put in touch with a great great granddaughter of James who had a wealth of information on the family, including the portrait of James McGrath that is featured on this week's bulletin cover. She also provided the "missing link" that verified my hunch about the above mentioned nieces and nephews. As I suspected our recently-deceased eldest parishioner Polly Trump was a great great niece of lames McGrath, the great granddaughter of his brother Dr. Francis McGrath of Pittsburgh. THAT story is full of tragedy and I feel awful that I didn't have the opportunity to share all that I learned with Polly.

The photo of Mr. McGrath comes from the book "Members of the Veteran's Association, Pittsburgh Division, Pennsylvania Railroad" published in 1902. I assume that the date refers to when he became a member of that organisation as it clearly is NOT the date the photo was taken (he would only have been in his early 20s in 1857).
