- Instruction of students in core and possibly other various content areas required at the elementary or secondary level. Instruction shall include student guidance, discipline, welfare and safety, as well as effective teaching of assigned subject(s).
- Plan for student success based on assessed needs of individual students and the use of data to determine each student's current knowledge and skill level and to measure progress
- Work collaboratively with other teachers and support staff in addressing the needs of students
- Regularly conduct planning for lessons
- Maintain and provide reasonable and meaningful student grading and evaluation and able to communicate such information to student and parents
- Manage student behavior in the classroom by invoking approved disciplinary procedures



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- Actively participate in faculty and grade-level meetings, assist building efforts to plan, budget, implement, and evaluate the school's program and to do related work as required
- Follow school policy and procedures, standard practices, and approved curriculum, and will actively and positively support the school vision
- Assist in identifying and in complying with teaching and learning and student accommodation requirements under Individual Education Plans (IEPs) and 504 accommodation requirements as well as attend IEP meetings with SPED team when required
- Attend school meetings
