Position Summary

Implements the Response to Intervention (RtI) system and provides specifically targeted interventions at Mathematics for middle and high school students. This position requires creative and active learning. Activities should include movement and creativity.

Minimum Qualifications

- Bachelors degree from an accredited college or university
- Knowledge of math content, elementary through Algebra I
- Experience in working with children, grades K-12

Desirable Qualifications

- Fluent in Hawaiian language
- Experience in working in a DOE or Public Charter School
- Ability to communicate effectively with teachers, students, and staff verbally and in writing
- Able to follow written and verbal instructions
- Ability to read and interpret complex written material
- Reliability in attendance, punctuality, and follow-through

Supervision

Essential Functions

- Coordinate with the RtI provider the best support for students
- Provide high intensity support for all students including one-on-one and small groups
- Provide push in and pull out sessions with students specifically in regards to mathematics
- Create appropriate grade level assessments
- Collect and analyze data in order to make grouping decisions with kumu
- Plan and conduct intercession math camp and/or activities
- Provide feedback to the RtI provider on the effectiveness of the systems being used
- Attend school meetings, when required by Po'okumu
- Other related duties as assigned
