- Recruit members of the community to host various workshops and classes that will directly help parents
- Provide families with educational resources to help their keiki
- Distributes, conducts and analyzes surveys to assess the needs of 'ohana
- Review school annual reports to evaluate the effectiveness of their parent involvement programs
- Keep records of all parent involvement activities, reports, surveys, funding, annual program evaluations and communications to parents
- Maintain a parent resource center
- Attend professional development meetings at local, regional, and/or state level
- Attend all local meetings and trainings for Parent Involvement Coordinators
- Attend school and staff meetings, when required by Po'okumu
