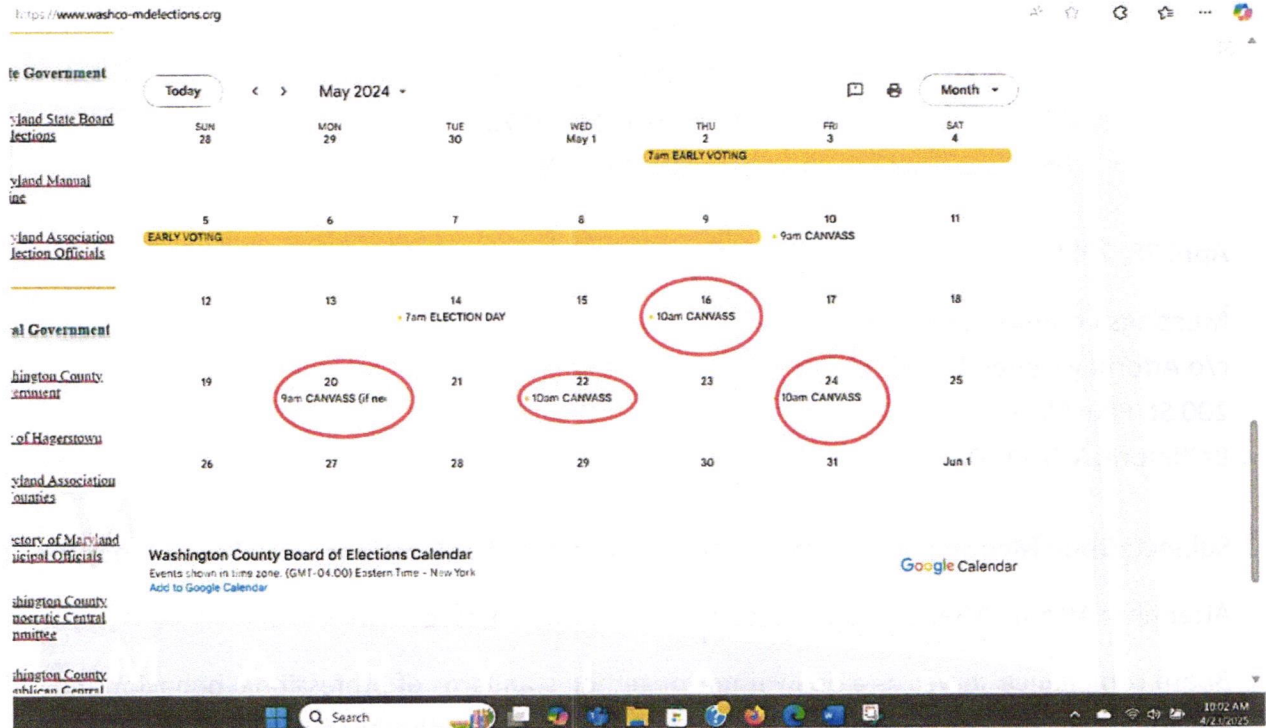

Dear Chairperson Marshall and Members of the Board:

I am legal counsel to the Washington County Board of Elections (herein referred to as the “local board of elections” or the “LBE”). Please accept this response to the April 28, 2025, complaint filed by Kelly Foster and forwarded to me by Ms. Simmons by email on May 2, 2025.

In her complaint, Ms. Foster points out that the minutes of the June 11, 2024, regular meeting of the LBE which were posted on the LBE’s website omitted the minutes of the local board of canvassers’ meetings of April 22 and May 10, 16, 22 and 24, 2024, all of which were approved at the June 11, 2024, LBE meeting,¹ in violation of the Open Meetings Act (the “Act”).

Upon investigation, the LBE staff confirmed that the minutes of the meetings of the board of canvassers were indeed not posted online because LBE staff have historically understood the minutes of board of canvassers’ sessions to be election administration records separate from the meeting records of the local board of elections, and not subject to the same online posting requirements.


¹ Pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Elec. Law § 2-202, the local board of elections serves as the local board of canvassers in administering the canvass and certifying the results of each election. The “board of canvassers” is defined by Elec. Law 11-101 as “the local board of elections in a county after the local board organizes itself for the purpose of canvassing the vote for an election in that county.”

We submit that not posting the board of canvassers' minutes online was not a violation of the Act, because, per § 3-103(a) of the Act, Title 3 is not applicable to "...a public body when it is carrying out: (i) an administrative function; (ii) a judicial function; or (iii) a quasi-judicial function..." The administration of elections involves the implementation at the local level of the processes of voter registration, voting, vote tabulation, verification and auditing in accordance with state and federal law. Under Maryland's Election Law, "[c]anvass' means the entire process of vote tallying, vote tabulation, and vote verification, culminating in the production and certification of the official election results." The canvass is conducted under the constant presence and supervision of the LBE in its capacity as the board of canvassers, as provided in COMAR 33.08.01.01, et seq. Mail-in (absentee) ballot return envelopes, mail-in ballots, provisional ballot applications and provisional ballots may be referred to the board of canvassers for determinations of compliance with applicable requirements or determination of voter intent and may under certain circumstances be rejected by unanimous vote pursuant to COMAR 33.11.05.01, et seq., and COMAR 33.16.06.01, et seq. Challenges to actions of the local board may be brought pursuant to COMAR 33.08.01.08. Judicial challenges related to the administration of elections are available under Md. Code Ann., Elec. Law § 12-202. We understand the role of the board of canvassers to be an administrative function and, as and when the board of canvassers rules on ballot matters, a quasi-judicial function.

It should be noted that the LBE maintains, and has at all times relevant hereto maintained, copies of the board of canvassers' minutes available for public inspection and copying upon request during business hours. However, no request for inspection or copying was made in this instance by Ms. Foster.

Should the Open Meetings Compliance Board determine that § 3-306(e) does require the posting of board of canvassers' minutes online, we submit that any violation was inadvertent and the agency stands ready to take such remedial measures as are necessary to comply with the Act.
