ESAM CELEBRATES 35TH ANNIVERSARY

On Saturday July 27th, the Empire State Aerosciences Museum celebrated its 35th Anniversary with a plethora of special attractions at the museum and in the community.

The day started with a special ESAM breakfast.

At 10 am **ESAM President Peter Russo** led the Opening Ceremony for the celebration. Dignitaries in attendance included **US Congressman Paul Tonko** who presented a proclamation honoring the event. Also attending were two members of the British parliament, **Sarah Champion** and **David Linden**.

Bob Secreti provided his excellent services as Master of Ceremonies and Announcer.

The 109 Airlift Wing provided a C-130 for static display.

Special activities included open cockpits, tours, the **Adirondack Soaring Club**, a bouncy bounce for kids and discounted admission.

A series of musical acts provided live music all day. The acts were the SUNY Choraleers, Martin Wakesburg playing acoustic folk rock, Erin Powers playing classic country rock, Kevin Wayne's rockabilly and Kurt Siegel playing pop folk rock.

Because the celebration coincided with the 50th Anniversary of the first moon landing, the museum's own **Kevin Millington** made a presentation on the Apollo 11 moon landing flight, complete with the museum's image of the Apollo 11 logo signed by **Neil Armstrong**, **Buzz Aldrin** and **Michael Collins**.

Food was available courtesy of the **Restoration Team**.

Helicopter rides were available from Independent Helicopters.

Vintage aircraft were on display including Chinese and French trainers.

The documentary **Return to Hardwick** about the 93rd Bomb Group in World War II was shown at the **Scotia Cinema** on Saturday and Sunday (although the Sunday showing was cut short by a severe thunderstorm that knocked out power to the theater and many other buildings in the area). The film's Producer and Director **Michael Sellers** attended and provided insights about the film.

All in all it was a grand celebration. Thanks to the many volunteers and businesses who supported it. Support was provided by **Ed Kosier**, **Hannaford**, **Russo Entertainment**, **Scotia Cinema** and **Wal-Mart**.

THE VIETNAM HELICOPTER EXPERIENCE

On June 15, 2019 **Jay Fuller** made a presentation at the ESAM Fly-In Breakfast about his experiences as a helicopter pilot in Vietnam. Jay was attached to the 101st Airborne Division flying UH-1 Hueys. Hueys served many purposes in Vietnam including combat assault (Slicks), gunships and medevac. His unit's primary missions were air insertion and air resupply. His tour in Vietnam lasted from December 1967 through December 1968.

Initially he was stationed in the Mekong delta. Subsequently his unit was reassigned to the Hue area to the north. Operations were very different in the two areas. In the flat delta of southern South Vietnam he would often fly in large formations of helicopters. In the mountainous areas of northern South Vietnam he would often fly in trail positions with one helicopter at a time landing and taking off from the objective area.

During his presentation Jay covered the aircraft, missions, geography and living conditions. In regard to living conditions he was grateful for having the luxury of a tent over his head at his helicopter bases. He was normally on duty from 7 am to 7 pm seven days a week. Most missions were an hour or more in duration. His maximum number of landings in a day during his tour was 17 landings.

Classes were provided on the history of aviation, the physics, or forces, of flight, and in the preparation of flight plans, and much more – we enjoyed presentations from **Larry McArthur** on Naval Aviation and flight gear and from **Yves Nollet** on gliders and soaring, visited Stratton Air Base and boarded an LC-130 Hercules, AND each student got an actual flight, compliments of volunteers **John Baldosaro** and **Joel Glickman**.

Rachel Rourke once again developed and oversaw the program, and she did her usual wonderful job. The program is undertaken in partnership with Schenectady County Community College's Office of Work Force Development and Community Education, and many thanks to Maria Kotary of that office. Partnerships are so important to our success, and SCCC is certainly among our best partners.

The program could not have been undertaken without our great volunteers — John Baldosaro, Lynn Chevalier, Gary Davis, Michael Dreibelbis, Gary Gershon, Joel Glickman, Rachelle Meerschaert, Yves Nollet, and John Panoski, as well as the Young Ambassadors, many of whom previously were students, including Sean Claesgens, Marisa Dreibelbis, James Emmick, Isaiah Gershon, Ashlyn Hunter, George Hunter, Robert Hunter, and Luke Hunter. We concluded the week on Friday with a "graduation" party for the students, their families, and volunteers, which included a visit from **Senator Jim Tedisco**, who recognized the students and ESAM, and who continues to be such a strong supporter of ESAM, as well as remarks from **President Peter Russo**.


I was so happy and proud to be affiliated with such a wonderful program.


