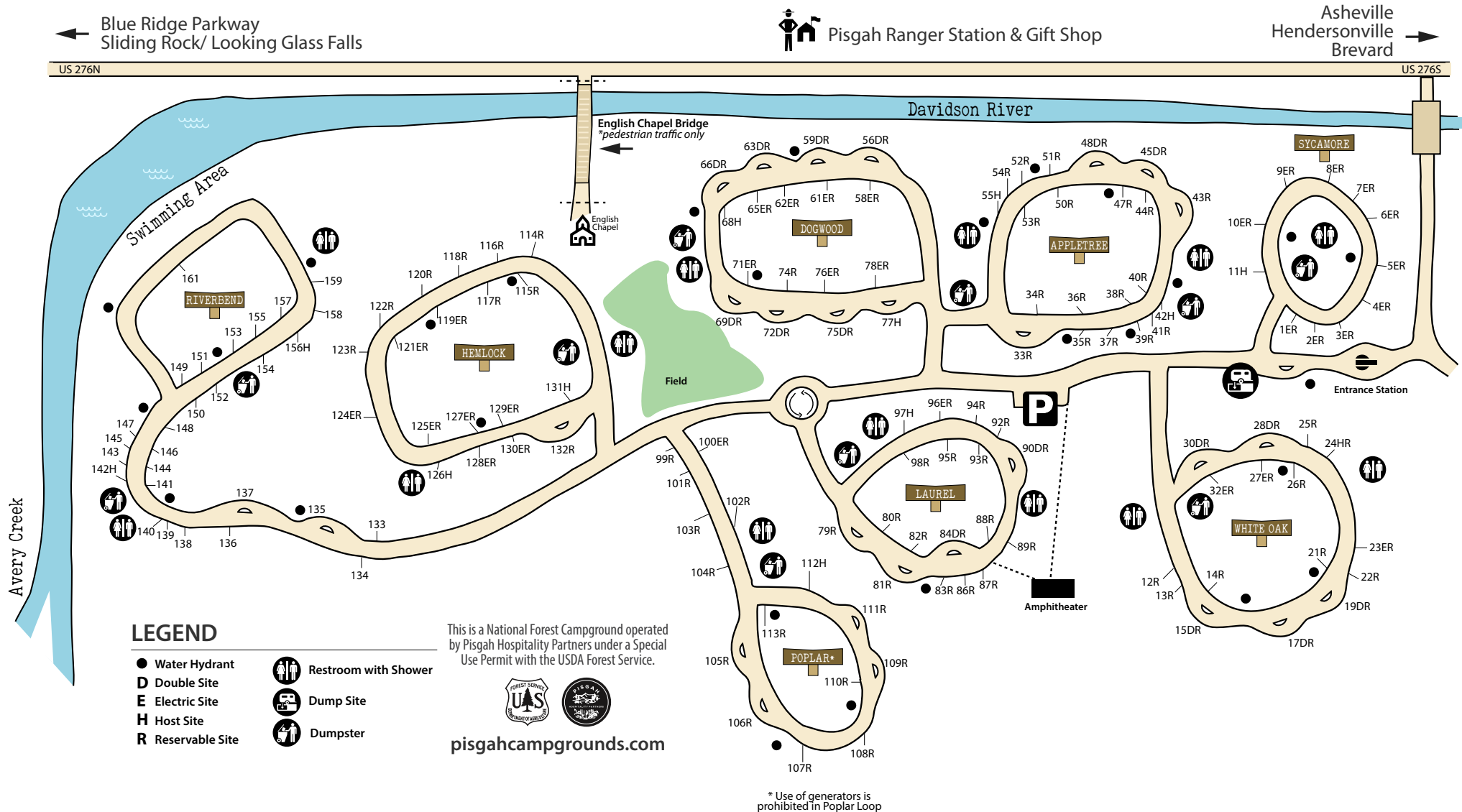

Hours:

- Gatehouse: 7am - 10pm, April 30 to October 29
- Check-out time is 12pm. Campsites must be renewed by 10am.
- Quiet hours: 10pm to 7am

Rentals: Site rentals are only available to individuals who are at least 18 years old. All activities at the campsite are the responsibility of the renter, and sites must be occupied on the first night of the visit.

Reservations are available online or by phone and must be made at least four days in advance of the arrival date. Contact the National Recreation Reservation Service at 877-444-6777 or recreation.gov.

Stay Limits:

- 14 days within a 30-day time period
- The cumulative 14 day stay limit applies to all Forest Service areas within 10 miles of the previously occupied campsite. Included in a cumulative stay limit: Davidson River, Lake Powhatan, North Mills River and Sunburst.

Campsite Capacity:

- Single campsites: up to 8 people, 2 vehicles and 1 wheeled camper
- Double campsites: up to 16 people, 4 vehicles and 2 wheeled campers
- Fees will be added for additional vehicles; any vehicle that does not fit on the pavement at the campsite must be relocated to the overflow parking area.

Visitors:

- Hang tags are available (and required) at the gatehouse for any visitor.
- Obtain the hang tag upon entrance, and return it when exiting.
- Visitors must exit the campground by 9pm. The campground gate closes at 10pm.

Parking: Do not park on the grass, in vacant campsites or on the road. RVs and vehicles must back into campsites. Please secure wheels on parking spurs or tent pads.

Speed Limit: Visitors must adhere to traffic signs and the 15-MPH speed limit in accordance with NC State Law.

Refunds: All site refund requests are processed through the National Recreation Reservation Service at 877-444-6777 or recreation.gov. Refunds are not granted for weather-related circumstances; they are only considered for emergency situations.

Federal Interagency Passes (Senior and Access) are only permitted for single campsites. The person who uses the pass and occupies the campsite must be the same person to whom the pass was issued.

Pets: Keep all pets leashed or caged during your visit to the campground. Pets are not allowed in bathrooms. Clean up after your pet throughout your stay.

Weapons and Fireworks: Individuals in possession of firearms must conform to NC State Law. Weapons and fireworks cannot be discharged inside the campground or within 150 yards of the campground under any circumstance.

Lost and Found: Contact the campground manager for lost items that may be in the Lost and Found. Unclaimed items will be donated to a local charity.

Water Tanks: NC State Law prohibits the connection of hoses to water hydrants in loops. Fill RV water tanks at the potable water station near the dump station.

Tents: Campers need to place tents within the gravel area of their campsite.

Campfires: Campfires are allowed in fire rings only; no other location is permissible for a campfire. "Dead and Down" wood is acceptable firewood, but do not remove trees, branches or any vegetation, whether living or dead. Damaging living trees is considered to be damaging federal property (CFR 261.9), a citable offense.

Food and Washing: Campers may not prepare food, clean fish or wash dishes at bathhouses or hydrants, as hydrants are not connected to the sewer system. All cleaning, washing and food preparation should take place at the campsite.

Generators: Campers wishing to use generators may do so between the hours of 8am and 8pm. Generator use is limited to four hours.



9 Easy-To-Find Waterfalls!

Looking Glass Falls The most photographed waterfall in the Southeast! From Davidson River Campground, travel north on 276 to the observation deck on the right-hand side. Steps lead to a lower observation point to get a closer view of this magnificent sight.

Sliding Rock Falls Continue past Looking Glass Falls on 276 north to the falls recreation area on the left. The falls are a big spot in the summer, and allow the family to slide down the smooth rock into a deep pool. There is a very small fee per car for this site in the summer.

Slick Rock Falls From the campground, travel north on 276 to the first road on the left, Davidson River Road. Drive 1.5 miles, past the Pisgah Center for Wildlife Education, to FR 475B on the right. Go 1.1 miles to a small pull-off on the right and hike approximately 200 feet to the waterfall.

Moore Cove Falls Travel past Looking Glass Falls to the stone bridge. There is a parking area on the right side and a new wooden bridge over the creek. The falls are an easy .7 mile hike, and are well worth it!

Laughing Falls Take a right out of the campground to the intersection of 64/276 and make a left turn (the road will be 280 here). Travel .7 miles to Old NC 280 and turn left. Take a left onto SR 1360 and continue until the road dead-ends at a parking area. To hike to the falls, take the right fork in the road and rock-hop the South Prong of Turkey Creek. Follow the road on the immediate left and head upstream to the falls.

Yellowstone Falls Head North on 276 to the Blue Ridge Parkway. Turn left on the Parkway and continue to a parking area at milepost 418.8. The trail to the falls starts at the north end of the parking area. Trail length is .5 to the lowest set of falls.

Toxaway Falls From the campground, make a right on 276 to the intersection of 64/276. Take a right and head into downtown Brevard. Take a left at the courthouse onto 276 south. After leaving Brevard, you will head up the mountain towards the Lake Toxaway community. The falls parking area will be on the right side at the top of the mountain.

Triple Falls/Hooker Falls These magnificent falls are located at DuPont State Forest. Drive through the intersection of 64/276 onto 64 east towards Hendersonville. Take a right onto Crab Creek Road at the Texaco station and quarry. Continue through the Crab Creek area and make a right onto Staton Road. Follow this road up the mountain to the Hooker Falls access area on the right side. Use the Hooker Falls road to see Hooker Falls, or cross Staton Road and hike the .5 mile trail up to the gorgeous Triple Falls. You will not be disappointed!
