All of the children in attendance received a holiday gift. Mothers who've been particularly involved with assisting Empowerment International were also recognised with special presentations.


Entertainment included student dance presentations, and a very popular "bouncy castle".

As of 2015, we now have over 300 students participating in our program.

**EI** provides mandatory uniforms, shoes, and school supplies, tuition, medical care, parenting programs (how to be more effective and supportive parents), home visits, enrichment activities, and counselling both individually, and in groups.

Since 2009 **EI** has achieved a school **retention rate of over 98%** within the program participants from the two communities where we work.

As of 2012 **over 87% of all school age children** are now attending school in **EI**'s first community, up from **55% when we began in 2003**!
