And it's because they have to play by the same rules and all that and if you don't know what the rules are that's a position of some disadvantage. So, having said all of that I always allow Pro Se litigants one opportunity to retain counsel if they wish to do so. So I am prepared to delay this not for a long time, but for a little while to allow you the opportunity to do that if you want to. But -- and you need to hear this, too, if I give you Okav. that opportunity and you don't do it, then we're going to have to have this hearing and the chips are going to have to fall wherever they fall. 0kav?
