



This odd looking creature is a bag worm. The bagworm caterpillar, after hatching, builds a case around itself made of bits of leaves and twigs. The female is stuck in her bag for good and the male just gets out briefly to

mate with the female who stays in her bag the whole time. The eggs are laid in the female's bag and the newly hatched caterpillars eat their way out and start building their own bags. Bagworms are all over the place. You will certainly see some stuck to the waterbarrel and the plant pots by the hydroponic garden.
