The 8th edition of AJCC includes a separate staging system for head and neck cutaneous squamous cell carcinoma (HNcSCC). It has been in widespread use since 2018.

As the world capital of skin cancers, we see a fair share of metastatic HNcSCC in Australia. Thus we are continuously examining our experience with various prognostic factors and staging parameters for the HNcSCC to improve the prognostic information we provide to our patients. We would like to understand your experience with the new AJCC staging system.
