BARTON TUTORS NEEDED PLEASE CONSIDER THIS REWARDING OPPORTUNITY

A foundational assumption of Open Education philosophy is that no two children are alike. We try to meet the differing needs of our students with programs that are best suited to their learning styles. One of those programs is the Barton System for Reading and Spelling.

We have had many dedicated tutors over the past several vears who have been trained to work one-on-one with a student using this program. Tutors work with a student twice a week, usually for one to two years. We do have a few dedicated tutors who are still working with students, but every year we need to recruit new tutors to meet the needs of children who are struggling to learn to read and spell. Tutoring is a great way to fulfill your participation commitment! We are looking for parents or grandparents who would be willing to work with a child for 45-50 minutes twice a week, either during or after the school day. For some tutors, it works best to tutor while their own children are in school; for others, the only time they have available is after school. We figure out a way to make it work for both the tutor and the student's family. Training for tutors will be offered based on prospective tutor availability, either after school on a day to be arranged OR on Saturday morning, October 12.
