

After a vigorous review process, over 150 papers were accepted for presentation at the conference covering the full spectrum of research topics. It attracted over 210 participants from all over the world, including Australia, Brazil, Canada, China, Denmark, France, Germany, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Italy, Japan, Malaysia, New Zealand, Nigeria, the Netherlands, Romania, Singapore, South Korea, Sri Lanka, Switzerland, Taiwan, Thailand, Turkey, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom and United States. The annual conference of HKSTS becomes an international event for exchanging and archiving knowledge on the development of advanced transportation research.



To foster excellence in transportation research and practice of students, our Society has established the HKSTS Outstanding Student Paper Award. The winning paper was "Effects of Multi-Tasking, Activity Envelopes and Travel Episode Characteristics on

Judgements of Travel Experience" by Soora Rasouli of Urban Planning Group of the Eindhoven University of Technology. There were two first runner-up papers this year and they were: "Robust Transit Network Design with Stochastic Demand Considering Development Density" by Kun An of the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering, the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology and "Reliability-Based Stochastic Transit Assignment: Formulation and a Paradox" by Yu Jiang of the Department of Civil Engineering, the University of Hong Kong.
