#### Tots:

#### Who is eligible for two year old funding?

If you receive one of the benefits listed below your child may be eligible:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Universal Credit (for children born after 1st January 2016 and whose parents are on Universal Credit, their household earnings must be less than £15,400 per year)
- Support through part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credits, with an annual household income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credits, with an annual household income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit 4-week run on (paid for 4 weeks after a family stops qualifying for Working Tax Credits)

#### Additional criteria - children are also

entitled to a free place if:

- They are looked after by Worcestershire County Council
- They have a current Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP)
- They get Disability Living Allowance (DLA)
- They have left care under a Special Guardianship Order, Child Arrangements Order or Adoption Order

## Let's Get Talking

#### More tips to support your child's speech, language and communication

**Giving directions**. Ask your child to give someone directions on how to get somewhere. They have to know words like 'left, right and straight ahead' first. Start with your child telling Granny how they get to school, but as they get better at it ask them to direct someone to less familiar places.

**Tell a story from your childhood**. Traditional stories are important for developing language but also culture. If you feel creative you can of course use props such as puppets or draw faces on your fingers to improvise

#### **Arts Week Parent/Carer Workshops**

#### <u>Year 2</u>

In Maths, the children have been counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and identifying and

recognising the 'odd one out' in number sequences. Following this, they have been using this knowledge to solve statements such as,

Always, Sometimes, Never:

- When counting in 2s from zero, the numbers are even
- When counting in 5s from zero, the numbers are even
- When counting in 10s from zero, the numbers are even

#### <u>Year 3</u>



This week, in Guided Reading, we have been using our inference skills by understanding the text from what is implied rather than stated. Our Science work has led us to discover more about how a shadow is made and over the next few weeks, we are going to investigate how shadows change. In addition, to really understand the feeling of the air raid siren, the children will be surprised by the sound of the siren in their classes and have to seek shelter in their classroom, '*Morrison-style shelters*'.

#### <u>Year 4</u>

This week, the children have been innovating their own stories based on the 'Mountain of the Gods' Roman tale. In Maths, we have been continuing our work on place value by looking at 1000 more and less and comparing 4 digit numbers. The children have also been using atlases again to ask and answer their own questions about Italy. Ask your child what they found out!

#### <u>Year 5</u>

Dragons have begun to take over Year 5 - we have been beginning to create imagery to describe what Jormungand (of Viking legend) may have looked like. We have been developing our language in order to plan a poem about this creature that Gunnar fears as he plans his vengeance. Also, we have completed planning our science investigation into materials in order to produce scientific evidence to support our theories about which material would make the best weaponry. Our maths focus has been on negative numbers which has lead us to compare conditions between Scandinavia and the UK.



#### <u>Year 6</u>

This week, Year Six got off to an exciting start with our very mature children reading stories to the children in Nursery.



After that, the children were all engaged watching a short scene from Percy Jackson, thinking about how atmosphere was created. They are now learning to identify descriptive devices such as similes which will help them innovate this very action-packed scene.
