#### Rev. 21:10-14, 22-23 LIGHTS OUT

A power outage eliminates the usefulness of many appliances. Computers and mobile phones have batteries, but they have to be charged. Kitchens rely on electricity for food preparation. The garage door opener fails. And, of course, the lights go out. In fact, people sometimes describe a power outage in those terms: "Our lights went out." Much more went out, but the lights mean more to us than anything else.

Before electricity, the sun and the moon provided much-needed light. Without them, life would have been unthinkable.

So when the Book of Revelation envisions living in a world without sun and moon, the image is inconceivable. But here was a city gleaming like a jewel, fortified with walls, and penetrated by twelve magnificently harmonious gates, named for the tribes of Israel. Revelation says the heavenly bodies served no luminous purpose for this new Jerusalem. "The glory of God gave it light, and its lamp was the Lamb." No other light was needed.

Each of us has known a time when the glory of God was our only light. Our lives were dimmed by loss of income, friends, authority or electrical power.

When the light of our eyes finally closes, when the gathering darkness of death envelopes us, one light shall shine to dispel our fear and bring us home: the light of Christ.





with Pat Stefano, who is head of the committee (actually he **IS** the committee!) putting together the commemorative book for the sesquicentennial. Soon (and very soon) information will be forthcoming about family and business ads. These will cover the cost of the book so that it can be provided free of cost to our parishioners. I INTEND (and we all know what they say about good intentions) to write the DEFINITIVE history of the parish as part of this book and as my personal contribution to this important anniversary. Please pray that I actually take the time to sit down and (metaphorically) put pen to paper.

**SPEAKING OF SESQUICENTENNIALS** ... VERY recently the question of the

founding date of Saint Aloysius parish has come to the fore. Anyone who would be SO SILLY as to suggest that Fr. Bob - GREAT LOVER OF LOCAL HISTORY that he is would deliberately choose to overlook an important anniversary of one of his *children* obviously does not KNOW said Fr. Bob. Sadly, I have run out of room to adequately address the issue in this week's Rambles (I don't necessarily write the column in the order that you read it; I might - as I did this week write about the cover photo FIRST, even though I put it LAST). Additionally I need to do some more research before diving in. Stay tuned!

**COVER PHOTO:** Last, but certainly NOT least this week we feature Saint John the Evangelist "all dressed up" for Easter. What would an Easter display be *without* a statue of the Risen Christ? The statue features prominently at Saint John this Easter season.

A statue, of course is nothing but an *image* which reminds us of an important or beloved individual. There is nothing inherently special about a statue. And, despite centuries of "fake news" from the illand uninformed, Catholics do NOT worship statues! One could think of a statue as nothing but a three-dimensional photograph. We all *treasure* photos of our loved ones but we certainly do not WORSHIP them!

Mere feet away from the Risen Christ statue at Saint John's there is something (some **ONE**) whom we indeed DO worship. If you have been in that particular church during this Holy season I HOPE you aren't scratching your head at this point. Even if you haven't been there



I want to believe that the answer is a no-brainer. But in case there is ANY doubt I include this photo (I am resisting the temptation to make it even MORE obvious by circling it with a big red marker).

As Catholics we FIRMLY believe that in the Eucharist the RISEN PRESENCE of Christ is with us. Not as a symbol. Not as a metaphor. Not as a sign. Not as a memory. But REALLY AND TRULY. No ifs, ands, or buts. And HIM we **DO** most certainly worship!

Unfortunately, I didn't get a shot closer to Easter when the original abundance of flowers was present. However, the photo I took this morning (Tuesday, 21 May) illustrates some important realities. First, as the Easter season progresses, the flowers diminish. As nature takes its course we don't replace each and every one; symbolically this diminishing represents the passing of the season. We begin at Easter - and the whole of Bright Week - positively OVER-FLOWING with floral finery. Gradually, however, the flowers die off and the display becomes less and less impressive. Then, at Pentecost, a new explosion of RED flowers finishes off these most glorious 50 days. Second, the original flowers (that went home their maker) were cleverly - and economically replaced with some of the beautiful rhododendrons that adorn the Saint John grounds.

Many thanks to Stephanie and Toni Kostelnik, Lorraine Monahan, Eugenia Loyal, Patty Relovsky, and Susan Whetsel who "did up" the worship space for Easter. And throughout the year the above mentioned PLUS Joe Simko, Ken Monahan, Paul Herchko, Ed Ermine, Vern Ohler, Jim Haun, and John Relovsky slave away to keep the grounds looking SPECTACULAR. Because of that constant attention to the grounds the parish has the ability to use its own home-grown flowers as the Easter Season progresses!
