

Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29 THE GIFT OF HUMILITY

We learn humility in different ways. Sometimes we try to attain what is beyond our reach. We try to accomplish something we desire to attain. We fail. We humbly learn our limitations.

Sometimes we boast of our accomplishments. We have achieved much and we tell others the truth. But we lose the esteem of our friends when we do. Boasting might be honest, but humility brings rewards.


Still, some people erroneously believe that humility is weak and pride is strong. Some public figures - entertainers, politicians, and

professional athletes, for example - boast in the midst of combat. They want attention. They disdain the competition. Their success depends on their self-certitude.

Their fall is all the more sharp. In the end, even the most talented share the same mortality as everyone else. We are all humans. We shall all taste death. In the sight of God, humility is the only honest stance we can take.

The Book of Sirach urges us to conduct our affairs with humility. We will be loved by others and favored by God. We will recognize that in spite of our gifts, there is One who is greater: the giver of these gifts. When we acknowledge the might of God, humility becomes a way of life.

TWO WORLD VIEWS: Last week, quite INADVERTENTLY mind you, the 11:30 Mass at Saint John was omitted from the week's Mass schedule in the bulletin. Were I a parishioner who encountered that omission my first (and truthfully ONLY) thought would have been that a mistake had been made. I am pretty certain that such a response represents the worldview of the majority of our parishioners. However, there will always be that very small number of individuals who will IMMEDIATELY jump to the conclusion that something NE-FARIOUS is afoot. Forever reading the tea leaves, plumbing the depths for some sort of conspiracy theory, such persons deduce that the evil Pastor, without prior notice, cancelled the Mass. Why? **OBVIOUSLY** because he is **CLOSING** the church. Any argument to the contrary is shouted down with cries of "Fake News! Fake News! Fake News!"

OK, perhaps I went a teeny tiny bit OVERBOARD in that paragraph, but it does represent how I sometimes feel. Last week, whilst out of town (see below), I pondered the twin questions: "What is the BEST part of my 'job'? What is the WORST part of my 'job'?" To the first, the answer came quickly: "Working with people!" To the second the answer came even MORE quickly: "Working with people!"

Our chief shepherd, Bishop Edward Malesic will be here for the anniversary Mass

at 5pm, and then join us for the festive banquet to follow. (The late hour of the Mass - we would have preferred Mass at 2 or 3pm - was unavoidable due to another commitment on the Bishop's schedule.) This is NOT merely a celebration for this one parish; it is a celebration of the beginnings of Catholicism here in the lewel of the Yough. As such, ALL are cordially invited -ENCOURAGED! - to attend the Mass not just Immaculate Conception parishioners. Admittedly, as your Pastor, I have my own SELF-ISH motives: I don't want to be embarrassed - nor do I want this faith community to be embarrassed - in front of the Bishop, MY BOSS! And just in case you are unsure this Mass WILL fulfill your Sunday obligation, so look at it as an opportunity to sleep in that day!

As part of our sesquicentennial year a souvenir anniversary book is being produced. Our initial plan was to have this book ready for distribution at the banquet on the Eighth. Unfortunately SOMEONE got in his puny mind the idea that he was going to write the quoteunquote DEFINITIVE HISTORY of the parish. And (of course!) this undisciplined individual has been lax in bringing his "grand idea" to fruition (sadly, he has the bad habit of biting off more than he can chew). Thus the revised plan is to have the book available at the Amen Party in December which will conclude the anniversary year. The upside of this delay is that we will be able to

include a section, including photographs, of the Bishop's Mass and the banquet. I always believe in making lemonade every time life hands me lemons! (Or is it just that I like to justify my own failures with sugar-coated "upsides"?)

Last week, recognising that I needed to put the brakes on research and actually "put pen to paper," I made the last minute decision to skip town for a "working holiday." I escaped to Happy Valley for the express purpose of beginning the writing process. However, because I cannot surrender my obsession to uncover **EVERY LAST DETAIL research** continued even as I started writing. I did though, make SOME progress (THANK GOD!); by the end of a week I had devoted nearly singlemindedly to THIS project, I had written about thirty-five hundred words. You might wonder just how far in history those three thousand five hundred words took me? ALL THE WAY TO 1850; NINETEEN years **BEFORE** the actual beginning of the parish. Please PRAY for me as I struggle to finish this task by the time the printer needs it!

The cover features the three houses of worship occupied by the parish since @1870. The first church is visible behind the present building in an 1899 photo. (This is the only pic I have found with the steeple still in place on the original church.) It can be seen more clearly in this closeup from the 1887 aerial map of Connellsville, drawn by a ballonbound cartographer. The second church is represented by the drawing of the church that accompanied the newspaper story of the church's dedication in 1887 as well as a photograph of ruins of the structure after the January 1892 fire which destroyed it.
