Proverbs 8:22-31 WISDOM'S ORDER

The disorder of our lives keeps us from peace. We race from one event to the next. Emergencies keep us from getting done the work we had planned to do. Our homes need a little more straightening. Our children need a little more attention. Our patience needs a little less demand.

It can be hard to appreciate the order of the world around us - the rhythm of the sun as it gently runs its course, the miracle of plants as

they open with new life, the comfort of the wind as it cools and refreshes. The cycle of life and death, although it brings chaos to individual lives, is well ordered, and the world passes methodically from generation to generation.

That order is the wisdom of God. The wisdom of God speaks in the Book of Proverbs: "When the Lord established the heavens I was there." God's wisdom predates creation. God's wisdom assisted in creation. Creation works because of God's wisdom. God's wisdom continues to work around the world and within us.

The disorder of our lives may keep us from sensing the wisdom of God, but wisdom is there. God created us in wisdom, ordered our bodies and gave us health, implanted within us a desire to know our creator, and nurtures us in our hunger for charity. Even when we are busy, even when we are unaware, God's wisdom is at work, keeping the pace of our hectic lives.






Fr. Daniel Ulishney will be leaving Our Lady, Queen of the Yough Catholic Community.

This year, we will have a total of four

FAMILY nights with dinner included, AND four YOUTH nights with K-5th grade students only (without dinner). In addition to your family registration fee, we will also be asking that you purchase textbooks for your children. These textbooks will be used at BOTH the family and youth nights. Our youth will also be working on their textbooks at home with you, the parents.

This does not mean that your child is to attend EITHER the family nights OR the youth nights. The program consists of a total of 8 meetings that we expect you to participate in FULLY. Because of busy schedules, we have noticed some families that have not participated in our family nights, and thus we have BARELY seen your children! This change gives our parents the ability to still participate in community with each other, but decreases the number of evenings you are to attend as parents. Our four "youth only" nights give YOU as the parent the ability to have a night off! Go to dinner! Go on a date with your spouse! RELAX!

However, if you WOULD like to stay for the youth nights, we would be happy to provide an Adult Bible study for you. You could also serve as a Volunteer for our youth nights. We will also continue our Mission I 19 at home family Bible program for those who wish to sign up.



SPEAKING OF TAKING OWNERSHIP ...

I cannot imagine that ANYONE who has attended Mass at Saint Rita in the past few weeks has failed to notice the beautiful landscaping. Once again, this is the result of parishioners stepping up and CHOOSING to give of their time in order to better their parish. Particular KUDOS go out to Anthony Lembo and Mary Kay Dunaway who have made it their personal mission to ensure that the extensive grounds at Saint Rita are as beautiful as possible. They were assisted by Mike Merendino and family, Janine and Rick Brooks, Chris Mickey, Amy Shelkey, and Toni Shearer.

At the risk of embarrassing him I must especially single out young Mr. Lembo. At only 27 he is an OUTSTANDING

witness to younger parishioners. His faith community is IMPORTANT to him and he is willing to **SHOW** it and to proverbially put "his money where his mouth is!" I hope his example will INSPIRE the younger adults of ALL of our parishes to get more involved!

AND EVEN MORE: At the beginning of the season we made the decision to contract out the grass-cutting at Saint Rita. Unfortunately the young man with whom we contracted only lasted a few weeks as he couldn't keep employees (sadly, a REAL PROBLEM these days). As the grass started to get out of hand Mike Merendino volunteered his (and his family's!) services. As I finished a wedding appointment at the DeVivo Centre it was a true joy to see two YOUNG generations working hard to make the grounds splendid for Pentecost Weekend. There was Mike and his lovely wife Patty (YOUNG because they are barely older than moi!), and their 20-something children Adam, Abby, and Maria, along with Tommy Hann, the not-yet-Catholic husband of Abby, and Tim Brown, the not-yet-Catholic fiancé of Maria!

MAY FINANCIAL INFO: The previous month was NOT a banner one financially. All four parishes were in the RED. Immediately above this I wrote GLOW-**INGLY** about the great things volunteers are doing at Saint Rita. In STARK contrast, however, financially the parish is lagging behind everyone else. Yes, the parish has more buildings to maintain but at the same time (as I wrote in this space previously) the per capita giving is significantly less than the other parishes. (I did that particular analysis prior to acquiring Saint Aloysius; it is time to run the numbers again for all FOUR parishes.)

The simple reality is that were it not for the festival - and a very few particularly generous parishioners - the parish would be SHUTTERED. Festivals EVERY-WHERE are becoming tougher and tougher to pull off; none of them will last FOREVER. And generous benefactors go to their ETERNAL REWARD. If **YOU** want **YOUR** parish to continue

to exist then **YOU** need "to put your money where your mouth is!" It really is THAT simple!
