Acts 13:14, 43-52 GOD'S UNSTOPPABLE SPIRIT

You cannot stop the Holy Spirit. The Spirit will flow and inspire, filling the earth beyond all borders. You cannot stop God's word.

They tried. The enemies of Paul and Barnabas tried to stop them from preaching. They tried to contain the message of the gospel. It did not work.

Paul and Barnabas, traveling on a missionary journey, spoke at a synagogue at Antioch in Pisidia. Many Jews and worshipers who were converts to Judaism listened. By the following week the crowds were so large that the Jewish leaders of the city tried to stop the apostles

from preaching. Paul and Barnabas simply preached to a wider audience. They no longer preached to Jews alone. Now they were preaching to Gentiles.

As Christianity continued to spread, the Jewish leaders started a persecution against Paul and Barnabas and expelled them from their territory. They did the only thing they could do. They went to another city. And they preached the gospel there.

If the Holy Spirit has a message, that message will be proclaimed. And if the message is within us, we will speak it. Not everyone is prepared to hear the message. Not everyone will receive its point. But the Spirit will speak.

When someone tries to keep you from saying what you know is important, the Spirit may be looking for a wider audience.





COVER PHOTO: This week a scene from Immaculate Conception's Easter glory is front and centre. Just as in the Saint Aloysius scene highlighted last week the theme of running water plays a prominent role. And once again the clever use of fabric "flowing" from a water jug (in this case an actual jug from first century Palestine!) worked beautifully to create the desired effect.

I mentioned last week - but it certainly bears repeating - that water is quite appropriate in Easter displays as the water of Baptism is the means by which we are made SHARERS in Yeshua's Paschal Victory over the grave. Which is why the celebration of Baptism is INTI-MATELY connected with the celebration of Easter. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA), promulgated shorty after the Second Vatican Council (1972 to be exact) and part and parcel of Catholic life ever since, resurrected this vital connection that had become obscured over the centuries. With that "resurrection" we have returned to the ancient practice of the Church, which saw catechumens spend considerable time being "formed" in the faith - up to three years - before being baptised at the Great Vigil in the most holy night of the Lord's Resurrection. Then, as now, adults are ONLY baptised outside of the Easter celebration for SERIOUS cause (terminal illness, or "danger of death" situations such as deployment to a war zone for example).

We tend to SO focus on the cleansing aspect of Baptism - to paraphrase that 1970s TV commercial* "It's gonna wash that sin right outa your soul, It's gonna wash that sin right outa your soul ..." - that we lose sight of the fact that metaphorically (and, in a true spiritual sense LITER-ALLY) we are dying and rising with



Christ. Just as too much water KILLS, in the waters of baptism the old self rooted in sin dies. And as water is absolutely NECESSARY for life in the waters of baptism we are **BORN AGAIN** unto Life Eternal. This symbolism was QUITE **OBVIOUS** in the ancient church: the Catechumen descended three steps, was immersed three times, then ascended three steps. Or even MORE clearly the Catechumen goes down three steps INTO THE TOMB, is plunged three times under water and DIES, and rises three steps OUT OF THE TOMB. (The number three, in case you are über dense, represents the three days Jesus spent in the tomb as well as the three persons of the Holy Trinity.)

There is SO much more to say, but I have exhausted my allotted space. More will follow, I am sure, in the future.
