ALAMEDA WALKS

2019 Schedule

All walks begin at 9am and last approximately one hour. Where walks are longer, it will be noted and new walks are indicated. Look for the red Alameda Walks hats! While we love the furry pets, we prefer that they wait for you at home.

May 11 North Shore Walk

Revisited – Meet at Grand Street Boat Ramp, north end of Grand Street. This walk will explore what is new about the north shore of the island starting at the base of Grand, following along the north shore around to Marina Cove Park and then cross over the Elector Littlejohn's Park and check out new all-inclusive playground.

May 4 Mysterious Medians Walk

New - Meet at corner of High Street and Encinal Market next to side entrance of Encinal Market and in front of the International Headquarters of Alameda Sun. This walk with look at the history of the street medians and their past purpose in the area. In addition the host will examine other local history of the area. Dennis Evanosky and Eric Kos will lead this walk.

June 1 Uplands of Bay Farm Walk

Updated – Meet at Godfrey Park, 281 Beach Road BFI (94502) in front of recreation building. This revised walk will focus on the farm lands that once dominated Bay Farm Island and its history. Dennis Evanosky and Eric Kos will lead this walk.

June 8 Webster St/Crab Cove/Sand Castle Contest Meet at the tennis courts, Lower Washington Park (entrance on 8th Street). The walk will end with the opportunity to check out the building of the sand castle and sand sculptures and to celebrate the 52nd Anniversary of the Contest.

July 6 Estuary Park, Ploughshares & Ferry Terminal Walk

Meet at Estuary Park, 200 Mosley Ave. This walk will explore the first synthetic turf lighted field, the nearby Ploughshares Nursery & the Ferry. In addition the public art near to Bay Ship & Yacht area will also be explored.

EBRPD Led Tour – Meet at Crab Cove Visitor Center, 1231 McKay Ave. Explore the Alameda shoreline, Crown State Beach Park and local wildlife. Then observe fish at the Bath House, part of the East Bay Regional Park District's Mobile Fish Exhibit. This walk is led by EBRPD Interpretive staff, Susan Ramos. Note: walk lasts 1 hour 15 minutes

August 3 Alameda Point South

Revisited – Meet at Encinal Boat Ramp, Central Ave behind Encinal High School. This walk will explore the varied history of this part of the island. It will examine the past and present activity on the former Naval base and much more. Meet at Dennis Evanosky and Eric Kos will lead this walk. Note: walk lasts 1 hour 15 minutes

August 10 Jean Sweeney to Marina Village Walk Meet at Jean Sweeney Open Space Park, 1925 Sherman Street. This walk will highlight the Jean Sweeney Open Space Park and then cross over to explore the Marina Park Village and shore line and fountains.

"May the Force be with You"
