Impact Austin Announces 2018 Grants Semi-Finalists

Eighteen Community Partners Selected to Apply for Four Grants Totaling \$446,000



Impact Austin recently announced the 18 community partners selected to apply for one of four grants to be awarded this year. Following a rigorous review process, the 18 nonprofits were chosen from 112 organizations participating in the preliminary round of application. Three program grants and one catalyst

grant -- each in the amount of \$111,500 -- will be awarded at the Annual Meeting on June 4, 2018. Program Grants will be awarded in the areas of Community, Education, and Health & Well-Being. The catalyst grant will support one nonprofit's plan to build its capacity and infrastructure. Learn more HERE.

Selecting the best-qualified nonprofits marks the first milestone in the annual work of the Grant Review Committees (GRCs). The next step in the review process starts the week of April 2 when the GRCs reconvene to select the semifinalists in each grant category. Semifinalists will be notified April 6. Site visits will be conducted with each semifinalist the weekend of April 19-21. Finalists will be selected by the GRCs the week of April 30 and notified on May 4.

g3 Announces Finalists for its 2018 Grant

Impact Austin's youth initiative, Girls Giving Grants (g3), has chosen Austin Child Guidance Center and Foster Angels of Central Texas as finalists for this year's grant for a nonprofit directly benefitting youth. The g3 finalists were chosen from 45 applicants. Site visits with the finalist organizations will be conducted in early April, and the g3 grant of \$8200 will be awarded later that month.



Community Partners Reflect the Purpose and Power of Impact Austin

Past Years' Impact Austin Grants Kick-started Ongoing Community Work

Every year in January, dozens of Impact Austin members gather into teams to begin the rigorous process that ultimately leads to our grant awards in June. Year over year, community organizations present impactful, far-reaching programs that earn our investment.

Grant recipients, which we call our Community Partners, are the heart and soul of why we do what we do. In honor of Impact Austin's 15th Anniversary year, we take a look back at a few of our past grant recipients whose great works continue today.

Community Partner TreeFolks Rebuilds Forests with an Impact Austin Grant

Since inception, TreeFolks has engaged thousands of volunteers to plant more than 2.5 million trees in Central Texas. Planting trees is a powerful means of connecting people with their community, and their neighbors. Trees clean the air and water, provide habitat for wildlife, produce fresh fruit for neighbors, and shelter us from the hot Texas sun.

In 2016, Impact Austin awarded TreeFolks a \$94,000 grant to support the Blanco River Reforestation Project. TreeFolks proposed



they would plant trees to restore the riparian forest on more than 1,000 residential properties in Hays County devastated by the 2015 floods. Many homeowners lost shelter and possessions and need assistance replanting their lands. Impact Austin funding

provided for landowner consultation and planting of 385,000 trees on 800 acres along the Blanco River, improving the ecosystem and providing healthy growth for future protection against flood damage.

Colorado River Alliance Teaches Water Stewardship with the Texas Colorado River Mobile Learning Experience

The Colorado River Alliance (CRA) supports natural science education and outdoor recreation programs that encourage the stewardship, awareness, and protection of the Colorado River, particularly to atrisk youth. The foundation also partners with other organizations to organize clean-ups of the lakes that make up the Colorado River.

The Texas Colorado River Rolling Exhibit, also known as the Mobile River, brings a water-science-center-on-wheels and classroom curriculum directly to 7th graders in the Texas Colorado River basin.



Launched in 2015 in partnership with the Austin Independent School District (AISD) and Austin Water, the Mobile River offers interactive exhibits and games teaching students about water conservation, floodplains and ecoregions. Impact Austin's 2013 grant of \$101,000 went directly to support the Mobile River with the purchase of a gooseneck trailer; the trailer design; fabrication, installation and upkeep of exhibits; development of the educational curriculum; and purchase of supplies for student activities. In the eight months following its premier, 600 students visited the Mobile River classroom. Since then, the Mobile River has expanded its reach at community events and water-related sites, and more than 10,000 people visit the Mobile River each year.

For schools that can't afford field trips, the Mobile River program brings the river to the classroom through cutting-edge technology. Connecting kids to their water source teaches them about personal water usage, water preservation and creates the next generation of water stewards.

Partnerships for Children Provides for Abused and Neglected Children

Partnerships for Children provides critical resources to abused and neglected children in Central Texas who are in the care of Child Protective Services. Each day, 850 children in Central Texas wait for a family and a place to call home. On average, they will move seven different times before leaving foster care.

The Heart Gallery



In 2016, Impact Austin awarded a \$94,000 grant to support The Heart Gallery, a traveling portrait exhibit and outreach program to teach individuals about children in the foster care system and the adoption process. The Heart Gallery has a 60 percent success rate of

getting harder to place children into permanent, loving homes. Before the establishment of Heart Galleries across the U.S. that number was less than one percent.

In addition to an Annual Reveal of the gallery, the traveling Heart Gallery is creatively displayed in unlikely locations: IKEA, ARA Diagnostic Imaging, Texas State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the Bluebell Creamery in Brenham, TX. For more about the Heart Gallery, see <u>HERE</u>.

Youth Empowerment & Success (YES) Mentor Program

In 2012, Impact Austin awarded \$103,600 to support the already successful Youth Empowerment & Success (YES) Mentor Program. The YES program identifies children 16 to 18 residing in group or foster care, and who would benefit most from a mentor and a financial literacy training program. Each participant receives a bank account with a stipend supported by a curriculum that includes banking, credit, saving, budgets, investing, and other topics as preparation to live as an adult.

A well-trained volunteer works individually to mentor a child until he turns 18 with the opportunity for the relationship to continue on its own, and they both meet once a month in small groups as well. The program strives to decrease negative life outcomes for these youth, such as homelessness, incarceration, unemployment, teen pregnancy, and poverty. For more on this program, see <u>HERE</u>.

Some 115 current and prospective Impact Austin members were treated to a morning of fellowship and learning at this year's Discovery Day on a chilly Saturday, January 13. Keynote Mellie Price, Director of Commercialization at Dell Medical Center, presented the audience with thought-provoking statistics about the health care industry and the challenges faced by medical providers, while explaining the necessity of available healthcare in economic terms.

Attendees also heard from panelists discussing community needs and the future of philanthropy. Impact Austin's Becky Austen moderated a panel featuring Kerry Rupp, Delia Garza and Josh Nelson, who discussed community needs and concerns in Austin: general affordability; transportation; affordable child care; and high speed internet access for families. A second panel, moderated by James Werner, offered specific takeaways for emerging philanthropists: teaching children about philanthropy and making giving fun; how companies can incorporate philanthropy into their business model; the importance of finding professional advisors who also care about philanthropy. Amanda Brown Irving, Yvette Boatwright and Kimberly Theodore Sidey were featured panelists.

In a highlight of the day, membership chair Rebecca Powers and Phylis Donelson announced that our membership numbers had exceeded the goal for 2018 by totaling 445. In a memorable moment for Impact Austin, Price asked for a waiver from the deadline in order to join as the 446th member for 2018. Price also said 'count me in' for 2019, serendipitously launching the upcoming year's membership campaign as the first member to sign up.
