Camp Fire USA Balcones Council develops responsible youth in central Texas through supportive informal education community programs for all ages. Camp Fire has an environmental emphasis. Whether in the inner city or at a park, the environment provides a perfect laboratory for discovery, curiosity, compassion and concern. Youth and their families are at their best when they can embrace these traits.

Camp Fire Kids Unplugged, a family outdoor learning program, gives underserved kids and their families the experiences and knowledge to become environmental stewards of today and tomorrow. Camp Fire Kids Unplugged strives to change the behavior of families by giving parents the skills to support their children's outdoor experiences, laying the foundation for environmental stewardship. It is the only program in central Texas providing introductory and supported outdoor experiences to low income families in a year-long program. It is an innovative program in which parents and children are learning together. Last year, Camp Fire Kids Unplugged served low-income families in 3 elementary schools. Impact Austin's grant will allow us to expand into 7 elementary schools in the Del Valle ISD where Camp Fire is currently operating environmentally focused, outdoor education children's programs as part of Del Valle's After School programs.
