I first learned about IA from two friends for whom I have tremendous respect - for the way they operate in the world in both their professional and personal lives. They told me that I need to come to a "coffee" to hear about the great things that IA was helping to make happen. I was heartened to hear the story of the XY Zone. I thought of the personal losses in my own family that might have been avoided if there had been a strong XY Zone program available. I pulled my checkbook out and started writing the check. I admit that I did so with the caveat that I would not be able to give much time to the organization since I had just bought a business and it was taking up most of my waking and sleeping moments!

Over that next year I came to realize that you make time for the really important things in your life and I began to volunteer in small ways with the organization. Each June was such a wonderful experience - learning more about non-profit needs in Austin and feeling the power of creating change with my money and my vote. I am now an IA evangelist - telling women I meet about the experience they also could have to take \$1,000 and turn it into \$500,000. I've been honored to be asked to serve on the board and help lead the organization through its next set of challenges. Urban Roots has also started a 40-member CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) program which community members can join for a fee to get a weekly assortment of fresh produce from the farm. The larger farm will allow Urban Roots to donate even more fresh food to local hunger-relief organizations.

Urban Roots will be on full display from December 5th - 12th during Edible Austin magazine's "Eat Local Week". Over 60 local restaurants and markets will feature locally-sourced menu items and products, with a portion of their sales benefiting Urban Roots. The week's events will include the "Urban Farm Bike Tour", the "Fine Food Art Gallery Night", and a screening of the movie "Fresh" at the Paramount.

The Urban Roots program gives young people a chance to grow in new ways. Chris, an initially shy, hesitant high school student, eventually became confident enough to walk around the farmer's market, promoting the produce and the program. When asked if he had accomplished the personal goals he had set at the beginning of the program he said, "I came far. I feel like I can talk to anybody."

Ballet East Dance Company Update

Students in the new Eastside Memorial Dance Academy look forward to performing for the first time on December 12, 2009. This program was proposed by Ballet East Dance Company and funded by Impact Austin in June of 2009. The Eastside Dance Academy provides top-level instructors in classical, contemporary, folkloric, hip-hop, and Broadway dance styles to students at the former Johnston (now Eastside Memorial) High School. While encouraging arts appreciation and understanding, the program supports students in valuing themselves, acquiring discipline, and staying in school. Ninety students have enrolled in dance classes at the Academy, and additional classes have asked for instruction, bringing the total number to 170 students.

"I like this piece," says Rochell, a ninth-grader, "because we two girls show we can be strong." "That's true," says Jorge, also a ninth-grader. "I like these girls, but I chase one and the other without thinking, and they both leave me. They break my heart!"

Grants Update

Join an Impact Austin Focus Area Committee/Signup Concludes December 7!

Are you interested in learning about Impact Austin's grant giving process and knowing more about the various nonprofit organizations serving the needs of the Austin community? If so, consider participating on a Focus Area Committee.

What is a Focus Area Committee (FAC)? FACs are the committees

responsible for reviewing Impact Austin grant applications and choosing the finalists our members vote on to receive funding. There are five committees, one for each of the Impact Austin Funding areas: Culture, Education, Environment, Family, and Health & Wellness.

What is involved in participating on a FAC? Participation requires a time commitment of approximately 40-50 hours between mid-January and mid-May. Time will be spent attending committee meetings, analyzing applications and doing research, meeting with subcommittee members, attending site visits, and helping prepare finalists for the annual meeting.

How will I know how to evaluate a grant? One of Impact Austin's key objectives is to educate women about grant giving and philanthropy. FAC chairs, liaisons and grant review finance committee members provide just-in-time training during committee meetings on all aspects of the grant evaluation process.

Is a FAC right for me? While there is no requirement to serve on a FAC, many of Impact Austin's members find FAC participation to be a challenging and rewarding experience. It's a wonderful way to learn about community needs and form lasting friendships with an incredible group of women.

What is the sign-up process? Completion of the <u>FAC Information</u> Form is a requirement to participate on a committee. Carefully read and respond to the questions in the form in order to sign-up. The deadline for completing the form is midnight December 7.

Recap of the 5th Annual Nonprofit Workshop

Impact Austin held its fifth annual workshop for Austin area non-profits on November 11th at the Goodwill Community Center. Sixty-seven representatives of local non-profits learned about our grant eligibility guidelines; the FAC review and selection process; and tips for preparing the most competitive application possible. GENaustin's Executive Director, Julia Cuba, also spoke about her agency's experience as an Impact Austin applicant and their success in becoming one of our 2009 Community Partners.

The final segment of the workshop included table discussions facilitated by Impact Austin members who have led a Focus Area Committee. These small group discussions have become the most valuable aspect of the workshop to the attendees. They allow the non-profits to ask questions in a more intimate setting and get answers from Impact Austin members who are experienced participants in the FAC process.
