Victoria Bergin

With any group of women working together, you might expect to need a trained mediator. But when Victoria Bergin, who regularly volunteers as a mediator in Spanish at the juvenile justice center and for the Dispute Resolution Center, came into contact with Impact Austin, she was amazed at how well this group of women works together.

"When I first went to an annual meeting," she says, "I saw 500 women with families, businesses, and full lives who were all coming together for one cause. And then, when I joined the FAC, these wonderful women came in who were all prepared and ready to discuss the proposals intelligently. It was wonderful."

Victoria first learned about organization early in its formation, as Rebecca Powers was recruiting the first 100 members. Victoria went to what she thought was going to be a meeting about business incubation and ended up learning about Impact Austin. Although she wasn't ready to join at that time, the idea stuck with her, and when she met several Impact Austin members at her neighbor, Susan Noble's, memorial service two years ago, she recognized them from that meeting almost ten years before. And it was time to join.

Are you interested in learning about the grant giving process and the various non-profits serving the needs of our community? Would you like to collaborate with a team of women responsible for evaluating Impact Austin grant applications and choosing the finalists our members vote on to receive our funding?

If so, consider participating on a Focus Area Committee (FAC). There are five committees, one for each of the Impact Austin funding areas: culture, education, environment, family and heath and wellness. FAC participation requires a time commitment of 40 to 50 hours beginning mid-January and continuing through mid-May.

This commitment includes five committee meetings, two subcommittee meetings, background research, three site visits to the semifinalists and some additional work preparing the two finalists prior to the Annual Meeting in June. It is a fun and rewarding experience.

"This is the way to give," she says. "You give \$1000 on your own, and it's not enough to make a difference, but if you get 99 other women to join in so you get \$100,000, you can really make an impact."

Vlcky talks about how much she likes site visits and touching the organizations that she gives to. Being able to see the trailer or the facility that you're donating to, and meeting some of the people who will receive services means that every one of the people who benefit from this grant is someone who you feel like you have personally connected with.

"I like to volunteer as a mediator because it's very personal," Vicky says, "For that moment, I am completely connected to the family I'm working with, and I might be changing the direction of their lives. It's much more fulfilling than writing an anonymous check. Impact Austin is the same way. I have a chance to give in a way that is very personal, and is changing lives."

Recap of the 9th Annual Nonprofit Workshop

Impact Austin held its 9th annual workshop for Austin area nonprofits on October 21st at the Region 13 Education Center. Manos de Cristo: Growing and Giving Thanks

Twenty-five years ago, one of our founders, Rev. Frank Diaz, spoke of the poor and homeless constantly knocking on the doors of his church, El Buen Pastor in East Austin. Many were young men asking for baby food. Rev. Diaz assumed they had children to feed. He soon found he was wrong. As he said, "these men would smile... But they had no teeth."

The local hospital could not provide the dental care they needed. People suffering from toothaches could not endure the pain, so they resorted to pulling their own teeth. Many even visited a local man working out of his garage who used pliers to pull their teeth for them. Something had to be done. The Manos de Cristo Dental Center was envisioned and created by many generous supporters in the community and a very determined Board of Directors.

The expanded Manos de Cristo Dental Center will celebrate its grand opening this November.

Twenty-five years later, Manos de Cristo remains the only provider of quality low-cost emergency, restorative, and preventative dental care and patient education. Today we serve over 4,200 patients a year in our clinic. And the need continues to grow year after year. To meet the growing demand, the Board of Directors developed a vision to expand from four treatment rooms to eleven treatment rooms and serve 7,000 more patients a year. After 18 months of planning, fundraising, and renovation, we are happy to announce that the expanded Manos de Cristo Dental Center will celebrate a grand opening this November. The vision to meet the growing need for emergency, low-cost dental care for people in poverty became a reality thanks to many caring donors in our community. Manos is very excited to be selected as one of this year's Impact Austin grant recipients. The generous grant will equip three of our new treatment rooms with the equipment and supplies to provide high quality treatment. These chairs will be visited by more than 3,000 lowincome patients a year. Over the 10-year life span of the chairs, over 30,000 patients will have been impacted by the grant.

At Manos, we'll be giving thanks for many blessings such as all of the amazing members of Impact Austin. Thanks to your generosity, we will be able to give children, adults and seniors the smiles they all deserve.

AVANCE : Austin's Del Valle Parent-Child Education Program

"Do you love your children?" Women of Impact Austin responded with a resounding "Yes!" Together you made the decision to change the trajectory of 50 young Latino children's lives - all from disadvantaged families living in rural Del Valle.

Before <u>AVANCE</u>, there was no early childhood development or parenting programs in Del Valle. Latino parents struggled, unfamiliar with the U.S. school system and dealing with poverty, isolation, and language. So did the school district. A large influx of English language learners was arriving in Kindergarten without knowing a single letter or color, and years behind other children who could already count, speak in complete sentences, and write.

From Sept. 2012 to May 2013, AVANCE's Parent and Early Childhood Educators taught weekly classes at Creedmoor and Baty Elementary. Parents

learned about their children's development and the importance of making their home environments stimulating. They were also taught English and connected to resources like foodstamps, domestic violence assistance, and computer literacy. In adjacent classrooms their children learned letters, numbers, and vocabulary. They developed socially and emotionally, and motor skills became stronger. Children got school ready!

Monthly, our Parent Educator navigated the pothole filled back roads of Del Valle visiting families in trailer parks and homes surrounded by corn fields and trees. Martha, a professional with 20 years experience in war-torn Colombia, came back the first day in tears. The poverty she saw in our mothers' homes was overwhelming - some families had no table, just a single plastic chair. During visits, Martha helped with parenting skills and screened children for developmental delays.

Stories like Natalia's underline the importance of catching issues early:

Natalia Nava, from Mexico, joined AVANCE with her children, 2 ½ yr. old Michael and 10 month old Sofia. From the beginning she shared concern, saying, "Michael does not speak and I don't know if that is normal." Martha evaluated Michael's social, cognitive, language, fine and gross motor skills and concerns were confirmed - he failed the language portion. We connected the family with a speech pathologist for specialized care. The evaluation prompted Natalia to take action personally. She now uses books and educational toys made in the AVANCE classroom with her children as a part of their everyday routine. Michael is progressing rapidly, and Sofia will never experience her brother's struggles because she is getting what she needs.

Thanks to Impact Austin, young children like Michael and Sofia gained access to early education, and mothers received tools to support their educational journey. Most importantly, you started something wonderful which we have sustained. At the close of the pilot we developed an innovative partnership with Del Valle ISD. Their Parent Liaison is now trained as our Parent Educator and uses AVANCE's evidence-based curriculum in the classroom, while home visits are conducted by our AmeriCorps member, a former AVANCE mom from the class of 1999! Today, we're serving a whole new group of at-risk parents and children at Baty Elementary, and giving them access to a lifetime of opportunities.

Girls Giving Grants Update G3 Celebrates Its Ninth Year!

Girls Giving Grants (G3) is in its ninth year of collective giving. There are 52 members this year from over 18 middle schools and high schools as well as eight dedicated adult leaders. Thirty-four nonprofit organizations applied for their grant this year and in April, one of them will be awarded \$5200. The girls began reviewing the grant applications in November. Last year's grant recipient was Easter Seals Central Texas.
