Community Partner Spotlight

Austin Theatre Alliance - The Paramount and State Theatres

The <u>Literacy to Life</u> program, funded by Impact Austin from August 2011 - May 2013, is a seven-week school- based literacy and performing arts program for 3rd grade elementary classrooms that transforms the students' understanding and approach to literacy and performance arts. The students work with four professional teaching artists and performers on creative writing, poetry, narrative structure, songwriting, and scriptwriting, and are encouraged to fill their journals with their own creative thoughts and stories. After the residency, the Literacy to Life teachers and performers, called The Story Wranglers, present a professional theatrical performance in celebration of the wonderful and creative work.

Communities In Schools of Central Texas

The Bastrop XY-Zone, the <u>Communities in Schools</u> program that was awarded a 2010 Impact Austin grant, has been going strong during the 2011-2012 school year. It has been filled with life-long learning experiences, and has had a tremendous impact on the young men, as well as in the community.

This year, the Bastrop XY-Zone program has intensively case-managed 48 adolescents on their journey to manhood. Each case-managed student has undergone a needs assessment and has an individualized service plan to promote school success and emotional health. The Bastrop XY-Zone coordinator has facilitated four support groups utilizing the XY-Zone's 5R's curriculum (Respect, Responsibility, Relationships, Reaching Out, and Role Modeling), where young men have shared their experiences with their peers, learned socio-emotional skills like anger management and effective communication, and developed a sense of cohesion and brotherhood. The young men have facilitated school-wide events, like the Live in Peace week and a three-on-three basketball tournament. They have also had valuable enrichment experiences, including visiting college campuses, presenting

The Bastrop XY-Zone has also implemented a number of service learning projects. The first was a beautification project at an east Austin nursing home. That experience really motivated the young men in Bastrop to "Reach Out" in their own community. Next, the Bastrop XY-Zone connected with the Bastrop Downtown Business Alliance, which seeks to promote and preserve business in Bastrop. The XY-Zone also partnered with Bastrop State Park to help with the rebuilding process after the fires. Finally, the XY-Zone has helped distribute food at a mobile food pantry every month, since the beginning of the year, in partnership with the Capital Area Food Bank and Southwest Key.

The program's success rests not only in current achievements, but also with the desire that many of the participants have to continue to give back to their communities. This desire ensures that the 5 R's of the program will continue to enrich young lives.

One of the participants in the Bastrop program was recently asked about the impact that the XY Zone has had in his life. He stated that without the XY Zone, he "would not be in school, and would probably be locked up". With the help of the program, he is not only in school, but is earning his high school diploma this May.

Girls Giving Grants

2012 Community Partner Chosen!

Girls Giving Grants (g3) chooses The Christi Center's Kids Who Kare Program as its 2012 Community Partner.

On April 26th, g3 members awarded a \$5,700 grant to the Christi

Center. The Christi Center plans to use the grant funds to finance the "Kids Who Kare" project. The funds will support retreats outside of regular support group meetings to facilitate team building, socialization among group members, and increased communication/ positive interaction with family members. Since 2006, g3 has awarded over \$30,000 to the Austin-area community.
