On Thursday, July 23, I had the privilege of participating in Breakthrough's Visitors Day, held at the summer program site on the UT campus. The six week program, funded by Impact Austin in 2008, targets economically disadvantaged incoming seventh and eighth graders. The students eagerly come to campus to engage in an academically rigorous program of English, math, social studies and science, complete with two hours of nightly homework. Breakthrough's statistics show that the students' participation in this intensive program minimizes summer learning loss, improves academic achievement, and helps the students and their families cultivate a "college-going attitude".

One Member's Story

Denise Jackson on her Focus Area Committee Experience



My life has always been extremely busy, I run a company in Houston, a small furniture refinishing business in Wimberley, am secretary of our home owner's association, a wife, mother, and grandmother. I feel like I am running all the time and several times when I was pressed to work on Impact Austin tasks, I wondered how I could have gotten into one more thing. But every minute I have spent working on a Focus Area Committee (FAC) has been an awesome experience. luminary such as Albert Einstein, or led the entire group in a campstyle cheer. I could feel the energy and commitment of the students and their teachers - I was ready to join right in! We moved on to hear a presentation by some students and teachers about the impact of the program on their lives. The students confirmed that their grades have improved, they get in trouble less frequently, and have developed a new sense of confidence and purpose in their lives. The summer teachers come to Breakthrough from local high schools and from colleges across the country. This year Breakthrough received a record 220 applications for 32 teaching spots in Austin!

A visitor seated next to me had been a "big sister" to Christy, one of the current teachers who had started in Breakthrough as a 7th grade student. As we walked together to a class to observe the Breakthrough program in action, she shared her astonishment at Christy's ability to speak to the crowd about her Breakthrough experience. She got tears in her eyes, saying "I hardly recognize her - she used to be so shy. Now she stands in front of a group and speaks with authority. She is a completely different person!" There was no doubt in either of our minds that Christy is well on her way to a bright future, thanks to Breakthrough.
