# **Our Grants in Action**



#### SafePlace

Through its grant from Impact Austin, SafePlace expanded its services to survivors of domestic and sexual violence through the establishment of an innovative Phone Counseling program. For survivors who, for a variety of reasons have difficulty leaving their homes, SafePlace's therapeutic counseling services are now available to them. The Phone Counseling program provides free, easily accessible, short-term counseling in English and Spanish and is very much in demand, as word gets out into the community about this exciting new service. Our 2008 grant has allowed SafePlace to serve 66 people since December 2008.



#### **Children's Wellness Center**

The Children's Wellness Center's (CWC) nurse assistant training program, which recently completed its grant cycle with Impact Austin, has made a significant difference in the lives of its participants and in the community. Fourteen young women and men from Del Valle attended an accredited clinical assistance training program and received valuable health care experience followed by a paid externship My Impact Austin experience is now an integral part of my life and has opened doors to several other community leadership opportunities. Austin is not just a city anymore it's now my home, thanks to Impact Austin.

at the CWC. Nurses and staff provided training, mentorship, career counseling and personal support throughout their experience. As a result, the CWC was able to increase its patient care services for Del Valle families, and provide invaluable training and work experience for young adults interested in the health profession.

# Our second group marks the 5-year membership milestone!



A sweeping view of Lake Travis provided a dramatic backdrop to an equally dramatic event. At the end of April, 20 women gathered to celebrate their 5th Anniversary as members of Impact Austin. As a special treat, representatives from Communities In Schools were on hand to provide an update on the grant they received from us in 2005. That year, Communities In Schools received one of two \$100,500 grants awarded. The group used the money to fund a start-up program called XY-Zone, a drop out prevention program for young men aged 13 to 18. The grant funded a full-time caseworker at two different high school campuses in the Austin Independent School District.

"Your grant came at a pivotal moment in our history," said Suki Steinhauser, executive director for Communities In Schools. She reported that our seed money helped establish the program and attract additional funding that has enabled it to expand to seven high schools in the Austin area. The group now plans to implement a similar program in area middle schools.

"Our 5-year members from 2005 deserve a lot of credit for having the wisdom to invest in Communities In Schools," said Rebecca Powers, our founder. "To think that our seed money helped grow this important program to reach greater numbers of young men and encourage them to stay in school and stay out of trouble--that's an impact we can all be
