Austin Partners in Education

Austin Partners in Education Reading Stars Program is Off to a Good Start!

Thanks to the Impact Austin grant, <u>Austin Partners in Education</u> (APIE) will provide 6th grade Reading Classroom Coaching to an estimated 450 students in 15 classrooms at Webb and Burnet Middle Schools in the 2011-12 school year. The APIE 6th Grade Reading Classroom Coaching program (RCC) empowers 6th grade students to become stronger, independent readers through Reading Classroom Coaching. APIE is investing in children, their education and our future. The RCC Program not only encourages children to read, but builds confidence, teaches community service, and provides students with a vision of what they are capable of attaining in the future.





APIE will provide 6th grade Reading Classroom Coaching to ~450 students

All 6th grade students will benefit from classroom based support for 45 minutes per week in small groups (2 - 3 students) for 24 weeks provided by APIE caring and compassionate adult volunteers. The students will work with the same volunteer in a reading group at their respective level and will receive specific customized and targeted instruction in a comfortable and familiar space.

In addition, APIE will introduce a new program called Reading Stars. Reading Stars is designed to encourage students to read, provide them with opportunities to be successful, create reading materials to support our local schools, and reinforce being a community member. They will work weekly with their Classroom Coach to perfect their reading; they will then have the opportunity to star in their own book-on-tape. The students will receive a copy of their recording to share with their family and one copy will be donated to the children at a partner elementary school. The students participating in Reading Stars will be able to share what they have learned with younger readers.

Classroom coaching will be launched in Austin ISD classrooms beginning in October. APIE currently has 95 volunteer coaches and is still seeking 94 more in order to serve more than 400 children. We're very excited about the Impact Austin grant and anticipate a very successful year for our students.

Impact Through Involvement

Sign up for Impact Austin's 2012 Focus Area Committees

Are you interested in learning about the grant giving process and the various non-profits serving the needs of our community? Would you like to collaborate with a diverse group of women who are responsible for reviewing Impact Austin grant applications and choosing the finalists our members vote on to receive our funding?

If so, consider participating on a Focus Area Committee (FAC). There are five committees, one for each of the Impact Austin funding areas: culture, education, environment, family and heath and wellness. Participation on a FAC requires a time commitment of 40-50 hours beginning mid-January and continuing through mid-May. This commitment includes training, 5-6 committee meetings, individual and team research, 2-3 site visits once semi-finalists are identified and additional work with the finalists prior to the Annual Meeting. It is a fun and rewarding experience.

2011 Member Survey Results

Thank you for completing the 2011 Member Survey! Your feedback helps us improve, and we take it very seriously.

131 members (24%) completed the survey this year.

Membership data: 1st year: 32 3rd year: 16 5th year: 17

7th year: 18

44 served on FAC this year: 89% had a good experience40 served on FAC previously43 never served on FAC

Respondents said:

98% were satisfied with the 10 grant finalists93% were satisfied with the 5 chosen as Community Partners77% read all or most of the finalist reports83% agreed that finalist reports contributed significantly to decision-making

Two most important benefits derived from volunteering:

- 1. Giving back, making a difference to the community
- 2. Support Impact Austin, helping it continue and improve

Three most important aspects of being Impact Austin member:

1. Making an impact and a difference in the community

2. Satisfaction in being part of Impact Austin, pride in what the organization accomplishes.

3. Learning about nonprofits in the Austin area and the needs they serve

50% have volunteered and/or made a financial contribution to an organization learned about through membership in Impact Austin.

64% learned about Impact Austin from the founder and/or another member

Top three reasons for joining Impact Austin:

- 1. 100% of my \$1000 donation goes to the Community Partners
- 2. Because pooling my money with others' donations has more impact
- 3. Because of the Impact Austin mission, process, and organization

Marketing:

- Evaluate current delivery methods of member communications.
