Finally, a grass roots organization that put everyday women to work to pool their resources and thoughtfully choose (via careful initial screening and consideration followed by a simple, democratic process) where the money goes in our community. I wrote the check and had it in my back pocket the day Rebecca and I met for coffee. I write that check with joy each year.

I've been a member all but one year since it was founded and it continues to be one of the very best investments I make each year.
