ICC's hotline

In the grand scheme of things, it seemed a simple matter. Her son's friend, Jason (not his real name) was recently abandoned by his mother and needed to see a doctor. The young man was already living with her family and she had power-of-attorney. Yet, her insurance company would not

consider him as an addition to her existing policy. You might call it mother's intuition or just plain good ol' legwork, when mom found and called the Williamson County Hotline for help.

The Indigent Care Collaboration (ICC), a nonprofit collaboration of 18 organizations in central Texas, created this centralized screening and referral system to simplify access to primary care for residents of Williamson County. Working in collaboration with Williamson County and Cities Health District (WCCHD), Insure-a-kid and the Lone Star Circle of Care, the hotline offers screening to match patients with available public health services and sets up appointments with a primary care provider within 48 hours at a publicly-funded clinic. Caseworkers also are available to follow up with individuals eligible for healthcare coverage to offer application assistance, answer questions about benefits and assist in the renewal process.

With the help of a \$104,000 grant from Impact Austin, the helpline went live on 10/1/07. The helpline took nearly 700 calls between October and December, scheduling 154 appointments -- all with very little outreach or marketing awareness. ICC is currently working to spread the word of their program and has developed a tri-fold card with information specific to their program. These are being distributed to social service agencies, school district nurses and local hospitals within Williamson County.

One of the biggest challenges of the program has been patients not showing up for scheduled appointments, according to Ann Kitchen, executive director of ICC. "We learned that this was not an unusual occurrence, and we adjusted our process to troubleshoot any barriers that would keep patients from keeping their appointments," said Kitchen. "This included same day reminder calls, working with patients on transportation issues and medical payment plans."

And what of Jason? He did make it to his appointment and, as a result, is scheduled for testing for a suspected heart problem. His foster mother says she will be forever grateful for the attention and care given to Jason from this program partially funded by Impact Austin.
