### **Big Tots**



### Reception

This week we have had an exciting week starting our Christmas activities. The children have been working really hard singing and practising play lines in readiness for the Christmas play and are very excited to show you very soon. In Literacy, we have been independently writing Christmas wish lists, applying the children's phonic knowledge. They have done this by making sure they stretch each word out and sounding out each grapheme before blending it back together and writing the word neatly on their Christmas lists. The children then had the excitement of going on a shape walk as well as posting their letters. In Maths, we have learnt about the number 10 and the 3d cylinder shape. I wonder if your child can show you some everyday cylinder-shaped objects? Winter bugs have been prevalent this term and so we have had lots of discussions about personal hygiene; including always washing our hands, using tissues and ways to keep those germs at bay! Fingers crossed for a healthier start to 2020. Well done to those children that are reading every day, lets see which class will be the lead next week!



### Year 2:

This week, Year Two have been continuing to help Beegu feel like she belongs by exploring the world around them, focusing on Peru and Kidderminster. They have been using compass points and grid references to explore these locations as well as the wider world and have developed their understanding of places near and far from each

Guided reading has also taken us to Peru, where we have been reading information including a fact about some mysterious Nazca Lines and retrieving the answers to questions from the text to check we have understood. In Maths, the children have continued to help Beegu understand money, combining coins to make different amounts and solving problems involving money like this one...



#### Year 3

This week, the children have finished writing their 'Wild West' stories and have created front covers so they can publish their stories in our class libraries. In Art, children have explored primary and secondary colours and looked at ways to make paint lighter. Once children were happy with their correct shade of colour, they creatively named them. We look forward to using our new colours to create cactus pictures next week. Our focus in Science has been friction, where we have tested cars over a range of surfaces to observe the difference in friction.

During our English lessons, the children have been writing the recount of their trip to the farm, using different sentence types. In PE, we are still focusing on ball skills in rugby. We hope you had a wonderful time too.



### Year 5

The children have been working very hard all week preparing for their Foodbank Fair on Friday. We are all very proud of their efforts. We will keep you posted on just how much money is raised for the local foodbank. Alongside their preparation, the children have been writing their escape stories, figuring out how Zoe will escape from Eels Island.

Next week is our Geography field trip - please remember to bring coats and shoes appropriate to the weather.

### Year 6

This week, the children have begun examining World War One diaries as a source of evidence. They have considered the features and discussed what they have learned about the soldiers living in the trenches. As well as that, following on from our debate work last term and the issue of whether children should be trained in First Aid, Year 6 were visited by St. John's Ambulance. Over the course of 2 days, all Year 6 children were trained in basic First Aid: how to conduct a Primary Survey (checking for danger), the recovery position, how to control bleeding and dealing with head injuries. In Science, the children have continued investigating the effect of exercise on heart rate and drawn line graphs to represent their findings.


