

You could be dealing with something serious that you've struggled with for many years, or it could be something small which has happened recently. Maybe you don't even know exactly what the problem is, but are finding it difficult to cope. Counselling offers a warm and safe space to talk in an environment with no pressure.

The first appointment or 'Drop-in' session is about gathering information. It is also about coming to a better understanding of your challenges. You may find, in fact, that this is all that is needed. If you feel that further counselling sessions would be of benefit to you, we offer up to six sessions of counselling, scheduled to fit with your college timetable, at the same time with the same counsellor each week. Counselling sessions last for 50 minutes.


