The event had 6 instructors throughout the day: Keith Owen (Idaho), Chad Lyman (Las Vegas), Ismael Gomez (Riverside Calif), Travis Joyner (Austin Texas), Jason Rebsch (Sugarland, Tx) and Ari Knazan (Victoria BC Canada). Each one shared techniques relevant to police officers and also Jiu Jitsu practitioners alike.

Ari Knazan, Co-Founder of Invictus Leo noted “those who attended had not only policing in common, but Jiu Jitsu as well. The energy in the room that day was remarkable. We are getting requests from numerous cities to do other events. And we are looking at new dates and locations.”
