Title: "Towards a Healing Journey: Self-Reflection Through Storytelling"

Title: "The Bride Price"

Description: In this workshop, the author of The Bride Price: A Hmong Wedding Story, Mai Neng Moua will discuss the importance of a Hmong woman writing about an issue that often dis-empowers Hmong women. She will talk about how her book is an example of critical self-reflection, unpacking the influences of culture, history, and religion on Hmong American life in the 2000s. She will also share the sacrifices of making an unpopular decision that goes against one's community.

**SESSION B** Presenter: Colette Campbell

Title: "Building a Collective Women of Color Leadership"

Description: In this break out session, Colette Campbell, Director of Talent Acquisition and Diversity And Inclusion at Bremer, will discuss the importance of seizing leadership opportunities by finding inspiration within ourselves and others despite feeling what Shonda Rhimes describes a "F.O.D.," first only different. Colette will lead the participants in a discussion around the possibilities found within a collective of Women of Color leaders. We are in a time in history where Women of Color leaders making positive changes within finance, politics, education, medicine, and many more areas. These women leaders serve as inspiration by shaping our history and contributing to the advancement of Women of Color in underrepresented positions. Colette will share her pathway to leadership which includes often finding herself as the only Women of Color in leadership spaces. Colette is a first-generation U.S. citizen born to immigrant parents, first to graduate college in her family and the first to have an "office" job. The goals of this session also includes examining where you are in your leadership journey and the forces that motivate you to proactively plan for your next steps.

As a community that places a high value on family support, it is important to have the capacity to successfully navigate the new financial landscape. This break-out session will provide an interactive and open discussion on how Hmong Women could lead the way in making a paradigm shift to strategic financial planning. This session will accomplish this goal through small group discussions on the gaps between the financial planning approaches within traditional Hmong families and planning for the new financial landscape. The presenter will conclude by offering a model of 5 key financial concepts as a tool for retiring wisely.
