


# Detailed download instructions Windows computers

## STEP 1 – Install the Javelin3 reader

Using your favorite Internet browser copy and paste the following URL into the address bar to install the Javelin3 reader.


<https://www.drumlinsecurity.co.uk/jw3setup.exe>



When prompted, click on **Run** to start the installation when using Microsoft Edge or Explorer.




For Chrome, click on the up-arrow at the bottom-left of the browser window that says jw2setup(3).exe, then click **Open** to begin the installation.




## STEP 2 – Install the Javelin3 reader (continued)

Click on the radio button to accept the agreement then click **Next**.




### STEP 3 – Install the Javelin3 reader (continued)

Click **Next** to accept the default installation location.




#### STEP 4 – Install the Javelin3 reader (continued)

Click **Next** to accept the default start menu folder.




## STEP 5 – Install the Javelin3 reader (continued)

Click **Install** to finish the Javelin3 reader installation.




## STEP 6 – Install the Javelin3 reader (continued)

Click **Finish** to open the Javelin3 reader application.



## STEP 7 – Download Pilot Weather e-book


Once the reader has opened click on the **Download** icon – see picture below.



## STEP 8 - Download Pilot Weather e-book (continued)


You are almost done! Type (or copy and paste) the following e-book URL:

**<http://drmz.net/pilot-weather.drmz>** into the window as shown below, then click **Download**.




## STEP 9 - Download Pilot Weather e-book (continued)

Use the default location to save your **pilot-weather** secure **drmz** file and click **Save**.



## STEP 10 - Download Pilot Weather e-book (continued)


You will be prompted to open the downloaded e-book – click **Yes**.



## STEP 11 – Enter the unique authorization code

Enter the authorization code sent to you in your confirmation email and click on **OK**.


This code is unique to you and your copy of the e-book. You will be allowed to repeat this process on up to two (2) additional devices using the same code (e.g., laptop/computer, tablet and smart phone). Please note that the **DocID** shown in the image below may be different than shown on your screen. This DocID is **NOT** your authorization code.


