## Our spiritual, sacramental and pastoral life in St. Brendan's.

Response to the Psalm: "Our help is in the name of the Lord who made heaven and earth."

The hymn numbers for Mass are displayed on the two Boards. Please join the community in participating fully in singing the hymns chosen for today and each Sunday.

**Living the Extraordinary Mission:** Pope Francis has called on all Catholics to renew their commitment to bring the Gospel to those who do not know Jesus Christ. This mission begins within our own family circle and circle of friends and neighbours. *This week the URGENT need for this in our parish has become clear.* 

- 1. Bishop Toal\_announced last week that in July and August 2020 there will be one Mass on Sunday in this parish. This is to allow Fr. Ness to celebrate Mass in other parishes in the Deanery where the level of participation at Sunday Eucharist is higher than here.
- 2. The sadness is that some of those who attend Mass in the parishes where he will go during the summer, live within the boundaries of this parish. The worry is that what begins as a temporary measure during the holidays becomes permanent. If that happens, the bishop feels that this has been brought about by families not feeling engaged with any particular parish. Any church will do <u>all</u> that matters is the time of Mass and the time taken for Mass to be celebrated.
- 3. Families have been asked whether they feel they belong here. Many people and many families do feel that they belong here and they show this feeling in many ways. *What do you feel*?
- 4. Families have been continually invited to take a full and committed part in the Sacramental preparation offered for their children each week in this parish for the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Many families have responded but not all.
- 5. There is a concern throughout the Church that we should abandon "Conveyor belt" sacramental preparation of children and young people. Instead we should emphasise the goodness found in willing participation in the life of the parish and we should try to show to others the excitement of the encounter with the person of Jesus Christ which is experienced and lived out here.
- 6. A Catholic child can be part of the Pope Francis <u>Faith</u> Award Scheme and yet not need to engage in the life of any parish or have any practical experience of any parish. An extra element <u>the Parish</u> <u>Commendation</u> is given to those children who do engage consistently in the life of their parish.
- 7. Should the Church stop trying to recreate the imagined former golden age in Lanarkshire and the West of Scotland generally and instead concentrate in establishing a parish community that:
  - a. is welcoming, hospitable and outward looking
  - b. is built on a sacramental life found through celebrating Sunday Mass and an active prayer life,
  - c. desires to know more about Catholic faith and practice,
  - d. commits to lead its children into a life-long relationship with Jesus through the Sacraments,
  - e. is founded on the active engagement of the laity as well as the ministry of the priest as servant leader who empowers the laity to live out its baptismal priesthood.

<u>Our sadness</u> is that the bishop had given us, priest and people, the mission of establishing a worshipping community on Sunday, founded on our spiritual, pastoral and social life. The two Masses celebrated here each Sunday are central to how we have tried to fulfil that mission among the many young families who make up the population of St. Brendan's Parish and whose children populate the Primary School.

<u>Holidays generally</u> - Fr. Ness will be absent from Wednesday evening until late next Sunday evening to allow him to travel to Modena in Italy to meet there with his son and his wife's family for the first birthday of his granddaughter, Rebecca and for the  $70^{th}$  birthday of his son's father in law. The Holy Ghost Fathers - the Spiritans - will provide for the parish in Fr. Ness' absence. His next absence is from  $18^{th}$  to  $22^{nd}$  November to visit his daughter and her family in Nurnberg.

#### PARISH AND PARISHIONERS.

### This Tuesday:

- Fr. Ness will be at OLHS all day. There will be a Liturgy of the Word in the parish with distribution of Holy Communion led by Evelyn, one of our three leaders. Each leader has agreed to serve for two weeks at a time. Booklets are available for all to participate fully.
- These liturgies will play a significant part in the spiritual life of this parish especially because Bishop Toal last week told Fr. Ness and all other chaplains that when they celebrate Mass outside the parish which Fr. Ness does twice a week, Tuesday and Friday at OLHS they should not celebrate Mass in their parish.
- The Caritas students of St Aidan's High School and Our Lady's High School have organised the evening Mass to celebrate the feast day of Pope St John Paul II at 7pm in St Patrick's Church. The students cordially invite everyone to join with them in this celebration with Fr. Krzysztof and Fr. Hamilton presiding, with the schools' chaplains, including Fr. Ness.

On Wednesday at Mass in the Hall we gave out a full colour extract from a Prayer Booklet prepared by the Parish of St. Peter in Chains, Saltcoats - 30 <u>Minutes of Prayer which will change your life</u>. Today as you leave after Mass you can collect another extract from this booklet. Bishop Nolan had not been aware of this treasure from a church in his Diocese and took the extract away with him to read. <u>Please take a copy of this second extract to your home to help you build a prayer community both there and here.</u>

**The Three-Legged Stool:** the part *parents* play in bringing their children to participate in the life of the *church.* This can't be left to the *school.* A visiting RE teacher at Mass here four weeks ago, took the copy of this article from our church to St. Ambrose High School in Coatbridge and used it in her lessons that week. She got a response. "You could hear a pin drop - and that's not usual." It shows the power of the Holy Spirit can be at work both among and through us.

Last Wednesday at 7pm in the Children's Liturgy Room we <u>explored our Catholic Christian faith in the</u> topic the Gospel of Matthew. This week Fr. Ness will be absent but he will prepare a paper to let those who attend review together what they have learned so far and talk this through using his Headings. The topics stand alone and so anyone interested can come on any week and still take a full part.

The Church desperately needs/wants to improve the knowledge people have of their faith.

- We will give out to children who attend the Children's Liturgy, the Parish's Advent Book for Children plus either the My Day by Day Advent booklet for Infants or the Junior booklet for older children. We will also give a print of each booklet to every teacher in the Primary School.
- *The Children's Liturgy programme* will be adapted from 1<sup>st</sup> December to help the children focus on Advent and the real story of Christmas and the birth of Jesus. All families are invited to take part.
- **We will open a parish spiritual library in 2020** paid for from outwith the Parish and located in the Children's Liturgy Room. We need to move urgently from physical/material improvements in buildings to concentrate on deepening the spiritual formation of parishioners both young and old.

In honour of Our Lady, the Rosary will be recited at the beginning of the Holy Hour at 7pm each Thursday followed by silent prayer. *Fr. Ness won't be here this week - the parishioners will cope without him.*The Wednesday Coffee Morning Mass community grows in strength. This really is a joy filled experience for the people who participate. *You too can take part*. The ladies and their supporters have financed the purchase of five new tables to arrive this Thursday for use in the Hall. Thank you from all of us.

The Food Hygiene training has been arranged for 11AM on Wednesday 13th November in the Hall.
