Living the Extraordinary Mission:

- Pope Francis has called on all Catholics to renew their commitment to bring the Gospel to those who
 do not know Jesus Christ. He wishes all people to come to love and revere the Word of God. It is Jesus who
 is the WORD. The Gospel of John opens with the words:
 IN THE BEGINNING WAS THE WORD AND THE WORD WAS WITH GOD AND THE WORD WAS GOD.
 Pope Benedict spoke, taught and wrote: IGNORANCE OF THE SCRIPTURES, IS IGNORANCE OF CHRIST.
- The Deanery Meeting last Thursday: Bishop Toal heard Fr. Ness describe the present celebration of Mass on Sunday morning and in the afternoon in response to the mission he had given all of us to build up together the worshipping community at Mass on Sunday in St. Brendan's. He accepted that a reduction to one Mass over the summer might break the connection which many families have made or re-made in and with the faith community here. Fr. Ness also explained that as he regularly visits his children throughout the year, he will be available to help in other parishes during July and August and that he will not need help to celebrate Mass here. He celebrated the Vigil Mass at Carfin yesterday.
- Bishop Toal decided to leave the matter to be sorted out between Fr. Ness and Fr. Bogan as Dean.
- **Bishop Toal repeated his concern about the celebration of Mass**. It must be central to the life of the Parish. Mass and homilies must be well prepared by the priest. Mass must not be hurried through and nothing should be omitted. Singing should be encouraged and full provision made for the participation of children and youth The timing of football matches on Sunday should not dictate the level or the nature of participation at Mass. Children's activities on Sunday are now a real challenge to regular attendance by families at Mass and, sadly, priests cannot presume that Mass on Sunday will be given absolute priority.
- **Bishop Toal proposed that Fr. Ness should present to him by 31**st **December** a written Review of his ministry during 2019. This should state the goals he had set for the year, the means used to achieve those goals and an assessment of the outcome. Fr. Ness will do this. Parishioners are invited to set out their reasoned opinions on the faith practice of our Parish in the last year so that the bishop will have a more complete picture. Please lodge these with Fr. Ness by 31st December so that he can include these.
- **Bishop Toal wishes the preparation for all Sacraments** improved throughout the Diocese. We try to show to all the families who celebrate Sacraments in St. Brendan's the excitement of the encounter with Jesus which we experience and try to live out as a community. "**We don't look at the Sacraments, especially Mass on Sunday as an obligation to be fulfilled."** [Patricia and John Milligan]
- Parishioners want everyone to feel welcome here. All information about the parish is shared with everyone at the earliest possible time. *Everyone is invited to feel that they belong here*. All people can contribute in very many ways to the life of this community and many people do contribute.
- The next absence of Fr. Ness is from 18th to 22nd November to visit his daughter and her family before Christmas. The Holy Ghost Fathers will provide Sacramental cover during these four mid-week days.

Each Tuesday: there will be a Liturgy of the Word in the parish with distribution of Holy Communion. Each Wednesday at Mass in our Hall we celebrate the combination of **the sacred and the human** by sharing hospitality immediately after Mass. This raises funds which helps to provide for the social needs of the parish. It is the largest attendance at Mass midweek in this parish. **The combination of the sacred and the human** marks the presence of God among us in a very special way.

November Lists are available for families to record the names of those whom they wish remembered in the prayer intentions at all Masses celebrated this month by Fr. Ness. We thank Elizabeth for her work in laying out the floral display at the altar and we welcome the large response in family prayer intentions.

Today at 2.30pm we will celebrate the baptism of John Paul and Celine Clarke's twin infants - Ruby and Freddie. In May Fr. Ness will become a grandfather to twins - children of his son and daughter in law. Later this month we will celebrate the baptism of another three children. During Advent, other than for a pressing pastoral need, no baptisms should be celebrated.

We blessed them as part of this celebration just as we had done with Patricia and John Milligan. All families with marriage anniversary celebrations in prospect can extend this to include the parish community as these two families have done. Wednesday evening Faith development at 7pm: teaching on the Gospels reaches the magnificent Gospel of John this week. This Gospel is so significant that this will last for two weeks. Topics stand alone and so anyone interested can come to the meeting in any week and still take a full part.

The Pope has set Sunday 26th January as a special day for all priests to stress to congregations throughout the world that *the Church desperately needs and wants to improve the level of knowledge they have of their faith and especially of the structure and meaning of Sacred Scripture.*

At Advent we will introduce at the Stall a new range of spiritual resources from Redemptorist Publications. Please think of purchasing at least one of these as a Christmas gift for family or friends to bring into 2020 a deeper level of knowledge and understanding of our faith and our faith practice.

- The Children's Liturgy programme will be adapted from 1st December to help the children focus on Advent and the real meaning of Christmas and the birth of Jesus. All families should take part. Children in P3 and P4 who have enrolled for the Sacraments in 2020 will receive a card to record their participation each Sunday. Fr. Ness will meet with the families in January to receive back from the families the completed cards and to plan for the Big Hug and the Faith Friends programmes. Caritas students from OLHS 6TH year have asked to be allowed to take part as leaders.
- At the Children's Liturgy, the Parish's Advent Book for Children plus either the My Day by Day Advent booklet for Infants or the Junior booklet for older children will be distributed.
- **We will open a parish spiritual library in 2020** to be located in the Children's Liturgy Room. Please look in at the room. See what the children have done over recent weeks and commit to using the library once it's in place.
