#### **COMPLAINT**

The Foundation for Accountability and Civic Trust is a non-profit organization dedicated to promoting accountability, ethics, and transparency in government and civic arenas. This complaint is filed pursuant to 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(1), and is based on information and belief that the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress apparently violated 11 CFR § 103.3(b)(2).

In early August 2019, numerous national and state media outlets reported that Sara Gideon made illegal contributions to the federal account of the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress during 2015 and 2016.<sup>1</sup> When a committee accepts a contribution that appears to be permissible under federal law, but later discovers that the contribution was illegal, the committee

must refund or disgorge the contribution within thirty days of discovering the illegality.<sup>2</sup> As such, the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress were required to refund or disgorge Gideon's contributions within thirty days of discovering their illegality.

As the information below demonstrates, it appears the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress failed to refund or disgorge Gideon's illegal contributions within thirty days of discovering their illegality. The Commission must immediately investigate and impose all appropriate sanctions for any such violations.<sup>3</sup>

# (i) The Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress accepted illegal contributions made by Sara Gideon.

## Contributions Made in the Name of Another

According to state and federal filings, Sara Gideon made four "straw contributions" to the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress, for which she received reimbursement from the Gideon Leadership PAC. Specifically, the Maine Democratic Party's federal account accepted a \$1,000 contribution from Gideon on July 11, 2016.<sup>4</sup> Two weeks later, on July 25, 2016, Gideon Leadership PAC disbursed \$1,000 to Gideon, the purpose for which was described as "Reimbursement For MDP Contribution."<sup>5</sup> The Maine Democratic Party's federal account accepted an additional \$500 contribution from Gideon on October 3, 2016.<sup>6</sup> Nine days later, Gideon Leadership PAC disbursed \$500 to Gideon for "Reimbursement for Contribution."<sup>7</sup>

The authorized campaign committee of Emily Cain, Cain for Congress, accepted a \$1,000 contribution from Gideon on September 30, 2015.<sup>8</sup> On October 28, 2015, Gideon Leadership PAC disbursed \$1,000 to Gideon for "Reimbursement for Federal Contribution."<sup>9</sup> On June 13, 2016, Cain for Congress received an additional \$250 contribution from Gideon.<sup>10</sup> That same month, Gideon Leadership PAC disbursed \$250 to Gideon for "Contribution - Reimbursement to Sara Gideon."<sup>11</sup>

According to 52 U.S.C. § 30122, "No person shall make a contribution in the name of another person or knowingly permit his name to be used to effect such a contribution." In addition, it is illegal for someone to make a contribution using funds provided by another person without disclosing the source of money at the time the contribution is made.<sup>12</sup>

### **Corporate Contributions**

Corporations are prohibited from contributing to a federal political committee.<sup>13</sup> Campaign finance regulations require that a committee participating in both state and federal elections (i.e., making contributions to federal candidates) establish a segregated account for federally permissible funds so that the account does not comingle federally permissible funds with funds from prohibited sources such as those from corporations.<sup>14</sup>

During the time period covering Gideon's reimbursement scheme, Gideon Leadership PAC accepted \$64,950 in contributions from various corporations.<sup>15</sup> Gideon Leadership PAC also accepted \$22,250 from other state political action committees that could accept unlimited

corporate contributions.<sup>16</sup> Gideon Leadership PAC did not register a separately segregated account for federal involvement with the FEC during this time period. As such, it appears that the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress accepted contributions from an account that comingled impermissible corporate funds.

## Acceptance of Illegal Contributions

The public filings and press reports make clear that Gideon's contributions to the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress were impermissible under federal law. When this reimbursement scheme came to light, Gideon "admitted to a campaign finance violation."<sup>17</sup> Indeed, Gideon sent a check to the U.S. Treasury in the amount that she had been reimbursed by Gideon Leadership PAC and claimed she had relied on "incorrect guidance."<sup>18</sup> Accordingly, the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress accepted illegal contributions made by Sara Gideon.

# (ii) The Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress have likely been aware of Gideon's illegal contributions for more than thirty days.

### Demonstrated Ties to Sara Gideon

Nearly three months ago, numerous media outlets reported on the illegality of Gideon's contributions to the Maine Democratic Party, Cain for Congress, and other state political committees. Both the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress were specifically identified as organizations receiving illegal contributions.<sup>19</sup> It is unlikely the committees were unaware of media reports directly naming their organizations and Gideon, especially given the committees' demonstrated ties to Gideon.

The Maine Democratic Party has active and ongoing ties to Gideon. It maintains a biographical profile of Gideon on their website related to her role as Maine Speaker of the House.<sup>20</sup> It is also actively invested in the 2020 Maine Senate race, in which Gideon is "the

party's front-runner."<sup>21</sup> Examples of the Maine Democratic Party's involvement in the race are immence: Since August 1, 2019, it has issued 21 press releases concerning the U.S. Senate race in Maine.<sup>22</sup> In September 2019 alone, it spent nearly \$10,000 in independent expenditures focused on the race.<sup>23</sup> It also has created a website solely devoted to criticizing their party's opponent and made frequent social media posts on the subject.<sup>24</sup> Given the substantial resources and focus it has devoted to the Senate race, it would strain credulity to suggest that the Maine Democratic Party was not made aware of any of the numerous national and state press reports critical of the "front-runner" in its primary election.

Cain for Congress is the principal campaign committee for the previous candidacies of Emily Cain. Cain also has a demonstrated interest in the 2020 U.S. Senate race in Maine. She expressed an interest in running against incumbent Senator Susan Collins late last year.<sup>25</sup> In June 2019, EMILY's List, where Cain serves as Executive Director, formally endorsed Gideon in her candidacy for the Democratic nomination.<sup>26</sup> EMILY's List has served as a conduit for 211 earmarked contributions to Gideon's campaign for Senate, totaling in the tens of thousands of dollars.<sup>27</sup> On its website, EMILY's List also lists Gideon as one of only four "Recommended Candidates" for Senate.<sup>28</sup> One month after media reports surfaced concerning the illegality of Gideon's contributions, Gideon attended a luncheon hosted by EMILY's List in New York City.<sup>29</sup> Given Cain's interest in the race and current ties to Gideon through the organization she leads, it is probable that Cain for Congress was made aware of Gideon's illegal contributions.

# Gideon and Gideon Leadership PAC Notified the State Committees Implicated in Her Reimbursement Scheme

According to a letter Gideon and Gideon Leadership PAC sent to the Maine Ethics Commission, when Gideon and Gideon Leadership PAC "were alerted to a potential issue with the contributions, they took prompt remedial action."<sup>30</sup> In the case of the two state political committees implicated in this reimbursement scheme, Gideon and Gideon Leadership PAC notified both committees of the "circumstances surrounding these contributions."<sup>31</sup> One of these state committees already amended its filings to reflect that Gideon's contribution was in fact a contribution made by Gideon Leadership PAC.<sup>32</sup> Within this amended report, the Commission notes that this change to its records occurred on August 22, 2019.<sup>33</sup> Thus, it appears that Gideon and Gideon Leadership PAC notified the state committees implicated in this scheme on or before August 22, 2019.

From the filings, it appears Gideon and Gideon Leadership PAC may have decided to promptly notify all committees implicated by her reimbursement scheme. Because they did in fact notify the implicated state committees, it is likely the Maine Democratic Party was also notified. Additionally, it is likely both the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress were aware of media reports directly identifying their organizations as the ones accepting illegal contributions from Gideon.

# (iii) As of their most recent campaign finance reports, the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress have failed to refund or disgorge Gideon's illegal contributions.

The Maine Democratic Party has filed two federal campaign finance reports since the date the press reported on Gideon's illegal donations and specifically identified the Maine Democratic Party's involvement in the scheme. According to these campaign finance reports, the Maine Democratic Party has failed to refund or disgorge the illegal contributions made by Gideon.<sup>34</sup>

Cain for Congress has filed one campaign finance report since the date the press reported on Gideon's straw donations and directly identified Cain for Congress as accepting the illegal contributions. According to this campaign finance report, Cain for Congress has failed to refund or disgorge the illegal contributions made by Gideon.<sup>35</sup>

### **REQUEST FOR RELIEF**

Upon information and belief, there is reason to believe that: (i) the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress accepted illegal contributions made by Sara Gideon; (ii) the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress have likely been aware of Gideon's illegal contributions for more than 30 days; and, (iii) within 30 days of learning of the illegal contributions the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress did not refund or disgorge Gideon's illegal contributions and have continued to fail to do so as of the date of their most recent campaign finance reports.

Therefore, the Commission should conduct an immediate investigation into whether the Maine Democratic Party and Cain for Congress violated 11 C.F.R. § 103.3(b)(2) and assess the appropriate penalties and remedial action.

# Collins Challenger Used PAC to Reimburse Own Contributions

Sara Gideon reimbursed herself for federal contributions, 'worst campaign finance violation,' expert says

Maine Democrat Sara Gideon repeatedly violated election laws by getting reimbursed for personal political contributions to federal campaigns through a corporate-funded

Maine political action committee, a review of both state and federal campaign filings discovered.

Federal election law explicitly prohibits individuals from making contributions in the name of another person or entity. The prohibition is spelled out on Gideon's own contribution page, which makes donors certify, "This contribution is made from my own funds, and funds are not being provided to me by another person or entity for the purpose of making this contribution." Yet Gideon, the Senate candidate anointed by the Democratic establishment to challenge incumbent senator Susan Collins (R., Maine.), appears to have openly violated this prohibition on four separate occasions.

On September 30, 2015, for example, Gideon contributed \$1,000 to Democratic congressional candidate Emily Cain's campaign, according to a Cain for Congress disclosure filing to the Federal Election Commission. A month later on October 28, 2015, Gideon received a \$1,000 payment from Gideon Leadership PAC, a Maine entity. The payment was openly described on the Maine disclosure as a "reimbursement

for federal contribution."

In June 2016, Gideon contributed an additional \$250 to Cain and was again reimbursed the \$250 from Gideon Leadership PAC.

Gideon is listed as the principal officer of Gideon Leadership PAC, and also a "decision-maker" responsible for its "spending decisions," according to an acknowledgment of responsibilities form filed to the Maine ethics commission.

Cleta Mitchell, a veteran campaign finance attorney who reviewed the filings, said she was surprised by such clear violations by a longtime officeholder and political candidate.

"Contributions in the name of another is probably the number one worst campaign finance violation under federal law," Mitchell said.

"I've seen laypeople who periodically need reminders that it's illegal to reimburse someone for a campaign contribution, but I've never seen anyone in the political arena, especially an officeholder, who doesn't understand that this is a serious thing you just do not do," she added. "Your donors are

your donors, and they better not be getting reimbursed by any third party."

Gideon also reimbursed herself for two individual contributions she made to federal accounts for the Maine Democratic Party. A \$1,000 contribution on July 11, 2016, was reimbursed in full on July 25, 2016, and a \$500 contribution on October 3, 2016, was reimbursed in full on October 12, 2016.

Erin Chlopak, who led the Federal Election Commission's policy division until 2018, noted that the Gideon PAC's acceptance of direct contributions from corporations further complicates things.

"Separate and apart from the potential violations of the straw donor ban is the use of corporate money to effectively contribute to federal candidates," said Chlopak, who is now director of campaign finance strategy at the Campaign Legal Center.

Among the many donors to Gideon Leadership PAC while she was using it to reimburse her individual contributions were corporate giants such as Walmart, Verizon, Time Warner, AT&T, Astrazeneca, PhRMA, Merck, Anheuser Busch, Visa, Comcast, and Aetna.

Corporations may be allowed to contribute directly to PACs in Maine, but are strictly prohibited from contributing to federal campaigns, Choplak explained.

"Corporations cannot make contributions to a federal campaign, and you can't circumvent that ban by using a straw donor to funnel money originally from a company to a federal candidate," she said.

Gideon has been hit by opponents in the Maine Senate primary for building her political career off corporate donations, with one primary challenger pointing to corporate support of her leadership PAC as evidence that she's a candidate of "special interests."

Mitchell, the campaign finance expert, said she was taken aback by Gideon's continued use of the PAC to reimburse herself for contributions.

"That's what's so shocking to me," Mitchell said. "She didn't do it just one time, she kept doing it. She signed that she's the decision maker, so I think she was the one making the disbursements."

"She'll just go write a check personally,

and then go back and reimburse herself with other people's money," she said. "She doesn't see anything wrong with that?"

Gideon did not respond to emails with questions on her contributions.

Gideon in 2017 criticized politicians who have "taken advantage of having a PAC for personal benefit."
