EXECUTIVE ORDER 9-006

**ESTABLISHING THE VOTER REGISTRATION AND OUTREACH  
COMMISSION**

By the authority vested in me as President and Chief Executive Officer of the University of Michigan Student Body by the Constitution of the Student Body of the Ann Arbor Campus of the University of Michigan,

I, Benjamin Gerstein, Student Body President of the University of Michigan, hereby order the establishment of the Voter Registration and Outreach Commission.

**A. Establishment**

1. The Voter Registration and Outreach Commission will advocate for voter registration across the University of Michigan campus.
2. The Commission will work in tandem with student organizations and University entities focused on voter outreach and registration.
3. The Commission shall be non-partisan.
4. Further, the Commission shall develop campaigns to increase voter registration on campus; working with each school and college, as well as residential halls.

**B. General Provisions**

1. The Voter Registration and Outreach Commission shall be bound by the rules, policies, procedures, and other regulations of task forces, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution of the Student Body of the Ann Arbor Campus of the University of Michigan and the Compiled Code.
2. Members of the Assembly or Executive Commissions who seek the use of the Voter Registration and Outreach Commission shall make formal requests to the President.
3. No provision in this Order is meant to violate, or shall be valid if in violation of, the Constitution of the Student Body of the Ann Arbor Campus of the University of Michigan.
4. This Order shall be effective immediately on September 3, 2019.
