

ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 7-038

A RESOLUTION CALLING ON THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN TO INVEST RESOURCES INTO ADDRESSING FOOD INSECURITY

WHEREAS,	The U.S. Department of Agriculture defines food insecurity as a household-level economic and social condition of limited or uncertain access to adequate food; ¹ AND	
WHEREAS,	41.4% of respondents living on-campus in a University of Michigan survey reported they experience food insecurity, ² meaning they are unsure of how to afford their next meal (Appendix A); AND	
WHEREAS,	In Ann Arbor, Michigan, excluding off-campus college students from U.S. Census statistics dropped the poverty rate for the City of Ann Arbor in half; ³ AND	
WHEREAS,	The University of Michigan campus is a food desert, which is an area devoid of fresh fruit, vegetables, and other healthful whole foods, largely due to a lack of grocery stores, farmers' markets, and healthy food providers; ⁴ AND	
WHEREAS,	Students need improved access to nutritious, affordable, and healthy food; AND	
WHEREAS,	The University of Michigan Central Student Government aims to address food insecurity on campus; AND	
WHEREAS,	Student organizations, such as Student Food Co and Maize & Blue Cupboard, have been organizing small-scale stop-gap measures for a few years, but lack the resources to address large-scale food insecurity on campus; ⁵ AND	
WHEREAS,	The University of Michigan School of Public Health's (SPH) Office for Student Engagement and Practice (OSEP) has recently started a new

project called the SPH Cupboard, which is a pilot food cupboard for SPH students; 6 **AND**

- WHEREAS,
 Students experiencing food insecurity are two times more likely to report poor health, two times more likely to report depression/anxiety, and 70% more likely to have an eating disorder, and students experiencing food insecurity are less likely to graduate from college/university;⁷
 THEREFORE BE IT
- **RESOLVED,** University of Michigan Central Student Government, in partnership with 11 school/college governments, calls upon the University of Michigan's leadership to identify and earmark adequate initial funding in the next two years in order to start and continuously support a Campus-Wide Food Bank; AND BE IT FURTHER
- **RESOLVED,** The Campus-Wide Food Bank should offer free fresh produce and other groceries to University of Michigan students; **AND BE IT FURTHER**
- **RESOLVED,** Central Student Government also calls upon the University of Michigan to invest resources into long term measures, such as food insecurity-specific financial aid programs and acceptance of Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits both on and near campus; **AND BE IT FURTHER**
- **RESOLVED,** Central Student Government will work with relevant university units in the development and maintenance of the Campus-Wide Food Bank; AND **BE IT FINALLY**
- **RESOLVED,** Central Student Government will work with relevant university units in the development and execution of long term measures addressing food insecurity.


