

**A RESOLUTION TO HELP SUSTAIN THE CAREER CENTER CLOTHES CLOSET
FOR NON-TRADITIONAL SIZES**

- WHEREAS,** Central Student Government strives to offer and provide resources that are necessary for any and all students to advance their education at the university¹; **AND**
- WHEREAS,** The UM Career Center has created a Clothes Closet that provides free access to professional clothing for students who may not be able to afford it themselves; **AND**
- WHEREAS,** The University Career center offers clothing to more traditional sizes of clothing ranging from Small to Extra Large, including suit jackets, shoes and pants sizes; **AND**
- WHEREAS,** The career center has clearly explained that they do not have enough funds to continually update the more common sizes; **AND**
- WHEREAS,** The career center needs funds not only to purchase clothing but also for clothing racks used during fairs, for bins during drives, and for general materials like pamphlets and flyers about the difference between business casual and business professional; **AND**
- WHEREAS,** The Career Center raised \$3000 but used almost all of it in less than a semester, they are in need of more funding to maintain this effort²; **AND**
- WHEREAS,** The Career Center hosted 1,030 students, roughly 30% of which were graduate students, in the fall of 2017 and 1,205 items were selected from their inventory³; **THEREFORE BE IT**
- RESOLVED,** CSG will provide funds to the Career Center in order to purchase the clothing products and resources necessary to maintain their current closet system; **AND BE IT FURTHER**
- RESOLVED,** The Career Center will keep an inventory list of items that have been utilized and items that have not and use this inventory to decide what to purchase for the next fair; **AND BE IT FINALLY**
- RESOLVED,** CSG allocates \$5000, from the Legislative Discretionary Fund, to provide the career center with a lump sum to allocate to closet clothing, materials, and specific amenities listed below not including salary of employee's. ⁵
