WHAT YOU WILL FIND IN AND AROUND CORNISH

ornish is located in the foothills of the White Mountains, midway between the coastal city of Portland and picturesque Mt. Washington Valley of New Hampshire. It is one of the five towns that make up what is called the Sacopee Valley. The other towns are Baldwin, Hiram, Parsonsfield and Porter. The word "Sacopee" is derived from Saco and Ossipee, the two major rivers that flow along our borders. You also can visit the nearby towns of Brownfield, Limerick, Limington, and Newfield.

Cornish has become an antique hunter's destination. You will find unique craft and artisans shops here. Local crafters and artists make quilts, felted goods, jewelry, forged steel, stained glass, "garden jewelry", hooked rugs, paintings, hand-decorated furniture, and more. Local farms raise livestock; horses, dairy cattle, beef, goats, oxen, sheep and alpacas. Other farms specialize in apples, seasonal produce, and offer organic CSAs. Nearby nurseries offer perennials and herbs, botanical apothecary shops, classes and apprenticeships. In the Cornish area there are picturesque vistas and waterfalls. If you are looking for unique dining or to stay awhile, there are a wide variety of restaurants and accommodations. Several internationally acclaimed seasonal camps are situated here as well.

The colors of the seasons inspire photography buffs and artists. Rivers, lakes and bogs offer fishing, boating and swimming. Many hiking and snowmobile trails offer individual challenges for the pro or novice. Cross country skiing and ice fishing are local frosty-weather sports with downhill skiing nearby. Geocaching has come to the area and there are interesting and challenging caches nearby.

For those interested in history, we have an active historical society and the genealogical resources that survived the big fire are open for your research. The area also features ancestors' homestead of Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, an historic covered bridge, golfing, and venues such as Parsonsfield Seminary and a couple of B&Bs for destination weddings, conferences, seminars, and graduations.

Come enjoy CAB sponsored timeless community events.

Cornish Strawberry Festival* started in 2012, is held the last Saturday in June. This event features unique vendors offering goodies, handmade gifts and more.

In 2016 the Cornish Community Harvest and Bazaar* was created to feature antiques and handmade finds, local cuisine and organic produce. Held the last Saturday in July at the Historic Cornish Fairgrounds.

Cornish Apple Festival* the areas first annual event started in 1989. Created to showcase the area when the hillsides are glowing with fall colors, on the last Saturday in September.

*Christmas In Cornish** is a way for CAB to thank the local community families for their support with a tree lighting, caroling and the Polar Express Trail. Held on the first Friday and Saturday in December.

Profits from all CAB events are used to help the community and promote Cornish and neighboring towns.

Giving back to the community – For the convenience of visitors to Cornish, CAB built and maintains public restrooms adjacent to the Bargain Shop across from the Thompson Park. CAB organizes volunteers for maintaining the painted brick cross walks, community projects such as; the wrought iron fence around Thompson Park, local food pantries, expansion of Bonney Memorial Library, and decorating the park seasonally. CAB also provides an annual scholarship to a local high school senior.

CAB maintains an active website, cornish-maine.org, where members showcase their businesses and also provides a community event calendar. The website also shows ways to sponsor our well attended community events. You do not need to be a member of CAB to be a sponsor of an event.

Annual dues are \$75 and entitle the member to a page on the CAB web site, a listing in this brochure and others through out the season, a listing on the member location map at the Thompson Park information kiosk, a reduced table rate at the CAB-sponsored events, opportunities to promote and network their business, and more. We encourage any business in the Sacopee Valley area to join.




