Yes, to have a formal and “public information” proof for Chromadex’s sub-licensing.

Since they hold licenses for materials, they can produce it elsewhere and sales it. I think that nowadays Chromadex is a pure trader/middlemen, it is neither manufacturing nor selling, it holds HQ, 2-3 people of QA and some accounts Mgr. So de-facto Chromadex is sublicensing through distributors like yourself and outsourced the manufacturing (they will have a case regarding R&D since they have expenses that related to R&D). My problem is to find a proof for sub-licensing (Linkedin, the Q-10s doesn’t say much about sublicensing, Dartmouth IP number on Basis and else wasn’t enough for our legal guys). I remember that you mentioned you saw or heard about an internal memo regarding denying sub-licensing but we can’t use that one.

There is a well know trick: IP owner sues a customer, like yourself, than you will ask to sue 3rd party (Chromadex) than Chromadex will ask to add Grace – that will demonstrate the sub-licensing. The problem that I’ll not get the approval for that move.

FYI - The issued the I raised:

1. Chromadex has SEC and Solvency Issues
 - a. CF and burn rate under great pressure
 - b. Inside trading issues
 - c. Major ownership been hold by a controversy person
 - d. Key personals are leaving the company
 - e. Material legal exposure – misrepresentation of CGMP certification (to all of its customers)
 - f. Have an issue with its inventory (can’t supply the demand)

2. Breaching Dartmouth’s License agreement
 - a. Avoidances of Sublicenses payments
 - i. Dartmouth didn’t get any acknowledge regarding Chromadex’s Sublicenses
 - ii. Published (10K) that Chromadex’s producer is W.R Grace (BTW – also published the agreement with Dartmouth)
 - iii. Have 1-2 employees that related to real R&D (most of the R&D expenses been outsourced)
 - b. Avoiding of “finished product sales” royalties
 - i. Chromadex didn’t include other payments it received for Dartmouth’s IP
 - ii. Based on an interview with one of Chromadex’s customer, it is assumed that the royalties reports are missing numbers
 - c. Last Milestone Payments
 - i. \$10,000 until 07/13/16
 - d. Insurance – it is assumed that the insurance isn’t complied with the agreement

Hi Adi,

Thanks for your note.

The following documents are public domain, and they demonstrate that ChromaDex agreed to purchase their NR from WR Grace (meaning they do not manufacture it themselves). In the second one, for 2015, they agree to purchase no less than \$6M of the material from WR Grace. Does this help? My sense would be that any

purchase from someone else who manufactures it would require a sublicense, but I do not know any of the details of your agreement.

We haven't tried to purchase it elsewhere, so I don't have any insight into that question. Clearly, WR Grace can make it.
