### Theme 3:

#### Description of a dilapidated house

The writer makes a notable effort in engaging the various senses of the reader. 'Musty, dank odour' appeals to the reader's olfactory sense; 'intermittent creaks and moans' appeals to the reader's auditory sense; 'dotted the ceiling in clusters' appeals to the reader's visual sense.

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## Theme 20:

Arrays of fresh fish, poultry and meat **glistened under the bright fluorescent light**.



The phrase 'constant source of bustling vibrancy' highlights the perpetual hustle and bustle commonly seen in such a setting. 'Boisterous shouts' and 'mingled with the voices of eager buyers' appeal largely to the reader's auditory sense, while 'glistened under the bright fluorescent light' appeals to the reader's visual sense.

- 2. The stallholders were busy selling their food items and groceries to the customers who bargained with them.
