# A GRADE MATCH REPORT

ROUND 1 V MODBURY

HENLEY: 10.19-79 MODBURY: 9.8-62

After a long but enjoyable preseason Round 1 was finally upon us. We had five players playing their first A grade game for the football club which is exciting for them as well as us, and even though mother nature didn't really come to the party it was great to have Round 1 at home in front of a big crowd.

In the first quarter our focus was on pressure and intensity and this was displayed in the opening 10 seconds when Brett Ebert laid a great tackle at the first contest. I felt we really dominated possession of the football but, as was illustrated on the scoreboard, we weren't getting reward for effort. Modbury were pushing heavy numbers behind the football which meant a lot of our shots were from difficult positions, but we still should have converted more of our chances. Jamie Grosser was reminding us of his ability up forward as he appeared to be everywhere and importantly at the feet of the tall forwards.

I'm not sure if we believed things would just continue to go our way but we simply got outworked by Modbury in the second quarter, we were not willing to work hard defensively as a team, which meant a few of their goals came from players streaming into their forward line giving our defenders little chance of containing them. When we had possession of the football, we were playing a bit too defensively using the safe kick down the defensive eastern wing. With the way Modbury were pushing numbers behind the ball this meant that we weren't giving our forwards much of an opportunity. With some more inaccurate kicking we only held the slimmest of margins at half time.

Looking at some of the stats we were still ahead in forward 50 entries so we knew we were having our fair share of the football, but our decision making going into the forward lines needed some adjustment. Again in the third quarter we won this stat but our skill level was causing us trouble as we continued to turn the football over. To Modbury's credit they were taking their opportunities and kicking goals while we continued to fail to make our shots on goal count. During the quarter we moved Brad Geddes back into the middle and he began to have an immediate impact but unfortunately at three quarter time we found ourselves with all the work to do.

At three quarter time we realised we needed to make some changes. Jeremy Johncock was moved to the backlines to add some experience back there and we cleared out the forward 50 for Brett Ebert and Jamie Grosser. This, along with us imploring the players to take the game on, and things started to turn for us. As soon as we got the ball out to space we started exposing Modbury, as happens in games of football we started getting the momentum and the players gained confidence from this. Brett Ebert was looking ominous up forward, while Brad Geddes and Travis Lane were enjoying having the ball put down their throat by Harris Jessen who was starting to get on top in the ruck. With the extra space up forward Tom Thunig was able to use his pace and after three bounces kicked the goal of the day to spark the side. In the end we more than doubled our score in the last quarter and got the all important 2 points.

Other players to play well were Tom Elfenbein, Cody Hicks, James Lean and as expected the skipper Michael Gautesen. It's important to win games of football early in the season and so from that perspective we achieved what we needed, although we know that we have some work to do and need to continue to improve.

## ROUND 2 V PAOC

HENLEY: 17.12-114 PAOC: 15.6-96

After a good win in round 1 we travelled to Park 9 to play PAOC, a team we knew would be very organised and who have added some quality to their midfield and forward line.

The first quarter was an arm wrestle, both teams had clean passages of play where they were able to hit a leading forward and convert that into a goal. Travis Lane was continuing his good start to the year, working well with the other midfielders and getting some clean clearances. Up Forward Brett Ebert was proving a handful for his opponent and kicked a couple of early goals. Learning from last week you could see we were trying to be more deliberate with our forward 50 entries but were just a bit off with basic skills. Unfortunately again some inaccurate kicking saw us trailing at quarter time but we felt as though we were right in the game.

In the second quarter we started well, we had made some adjustments defensively in an attempt to limit their ability to switch the ball to space and ourselves were working the ball out of our defensive 50 better by hitting up shorter free targets. I felt as though our midfield were on top at stoppages, especially early in the quarter, led by Harris Jessen who on a couple of occasions found himself rucking, then running the ball out of the contest himself. Tom Elfenbein's workrate and defensive pressure on the wing was again outstanding while on the other wing Cody Hicks was causing some headaches for the opposition on his left foot. However, the last 10 minutes of the quarter saw PAOC get a bit of a run on and hold the lead and the momentum going into half time.

In the third quarter we came out with a lot of intent which was best displayed by Lee Staple in the first minute when he chased an opponent down and won the free kick. The players were really starting to think about their football, cutting off the avenues PAOC were using in the first half of the game and being smart with the football when we had possession. After losing the skipper Michael Gautesen to a hamstring during the second quarter Jack Enright was given a bigger responsibility in the middle and he was relishing the opportunity. Not only was he winning plenty of the football himself but had a defensive awareness around a stoppage and was stopping their third man up. Jake Hyland also had a big quarter as he held the ruck duties for a large part of the quarter. PAOC fought back late with a couple of goals but the momentum was firmly back in our court.

At three quarter time we had a belief that we could outrun and outwork PAOC and in the end that is exactly what we did. The first 5 minutes were a bit of back and forth footy as we tried to just go long down the line, but with the numbers they had there, the ball kept coming straight back in.

Eventually we got our run and possession game going and starting outworking PAOC. Lee Staple had a great quarter providing a strong target and kicking two important goals. It was their forward line who earlier in the game were emptying out to clog up the space but by the end of the game it was our defenders who were leading them out and providing great run from behind.

Harris Jessen had a great game providing our mids plenty of first use and James Lean, while playing with the flu, was hitting in as we are coming to expect but also hit the scoreboard with three goals. Kyle Dalidowicz played his first A grade game and showed he was not overawed by the occasion.

Overall I think it was another step forward for the whole team, we are getting a lot more understanding of each other and how we want to play.

After a tough hard fought away win, the worst thing we can do now is to come home next week and not consolidate it. But we talk about consistency as a group and that is what we'll aim to bring.

Henley kicked off round 1 v Modbury at home and the C grade game was poised to be a real challenge based on the season Modbury had in 2017. They had only lost 1 game for the whole year and won the grand final by 7 goals and although it was a brand new season, a quick look at their team list showed a number of players from that game were still playing.

Henley entered the game with 10 players from last year's premiership team but had lost a lot of seniority with the retirements (hopefully some temporarily) of players of the quality of Gill, Newman, O'Donohue, T.K., Rosewall, Chapman, Graham, Butler and Portolesi.
