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1.0 Health Care Resolutions

1.1 Addictions Recovery

Whereas addictions recovery involves a major change in one's life; and,

Whereas the current 28-day recovery period mandated for government financial support falls short of the one-year professionals advise is necessary; and,

Whereas support for behavioural/psychological health is needed; and

Whereas the interdisciplinary care model should be applied to address psychological/PTSD trauma; and,

Whereas there is a shortage of community supportive/positive treatment housing;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal government will undertake measures to address the shortcomings in addressing addictions recovery needs; and,

Be It Hereby Further Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal government will mandate the additional recovery period to be no less than one year.

1.2 Rural and Northern Health Care Services

Whereas there is inadequate support for health care professionals and services in rural and northern areas; and,

Whereas Nurse Practitioners could help to address health care needs in rural and northern areas; and,

Whereas Nurse Practitioners do not have the recognition and support that is needed within the health care system; and,

Whereas staff numbers are often inadequate to address health care needs;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal government will undertake measures to address the shortage of Nurse Practitioners in rural and northern areas.

1.3 Neepawa Regional Hospital

Whereas rural Manitoba is lacking equitable access to healthcare; citizens are forced to drive beyond reasonable distances for simple procedures and services; there is a need for a Regional Hospital in the Agassiz Constituency of Neepawa to provide equitable access to timely services of healthcare; and,

Whereas Neepawa is a growing and expanding community in areas of infrastructure and growth; It is centrally located in-between Brandon and Dauphin, Portage & Dauphin, and encompasses services to all communities within a 100km radius (except Brandon); and,

Whereas Neepawa is becoming a hub for the region with a new fire station and proposed police station in the future, making healthcare the next logical step; and,

Whereas Neepawa has created a Community Clinic and has been able to recruit 9 doctors who are fulltime with various expertise in anesthesia, surgery and pediatrics; and,

Whereas Neepawa has previously identified a need for a healthcare facility; already planning for the building of a “New Regional Hospital” beside Country Meadows Care Home in Neepawa with infrastructure, land, kitchen and laundry facilities in place; which is also adjacent to Ambulance Services;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a new Manitoba Liberal government will build a New Regional Hospital in Neepawa, Manitoba; and,

Be It Hereby Further Resolved that a new Manitoba Liberal government will build a New Regional Hospital in Neepawa; attaching to the Country Meadows Personal Care Home; utilizing all the infrastructure already in place.

1.4 Clean and Drinkable Water Accessibility to All Manitobans

Whereas Manitoba currently have 63 communities that are under a “Boil Water” advisory; with 4 of those communities actually being under a “Do Not Consume” advisory; and,

Whereas there is a need for equitable access to basic needs in Manitoba such as access to clean water for consumption; and,

Whereas Manitobans feel this issue is important and support access to clean drinkable water to ALL residents in Manitoba; and,

Whereas Manitoba should see this as an urgent issue to support this basic right for all Canadians;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a new Manitoba Liberal government provide ALL Manitobans with access to clean drinkable water; and,

Be It Hereby Further Resolved that a new Manitoba Liberal government will work with our Federal Government to ensure that all Manitoban’s have access to clean drinkable water; and,

Be It Hereby Further Resolved that a new Manitoba Liberal government will promptly work with communities who do not have clean drinkable water in order to install water treatment solutions.

1.5 Professional Social Workers to be Registered

Whereas Recommendation 33 of the Phoenix Sinclair Inquiry Report recommended that anyone who practices social work in Manitoba under any title, must be registered with the Manitoba College of Social Workers; and,

Whereas the Social Work Profession Act was proclaimed in November, 2014 to come into effect April 1, 2015, with the Government of Manitoba indicating that over 400 employees will be eligible and required to register as social workers; and,

Whereas in March, 2015, just prior to the April 1st effective date, then Minister of Family Services, Kerri Irvin-Ross intervened to state that only those with the “job name” Social Worker would be required to register, resulting in hundreds of social work practitioners withdrawing or failing to renew their application for registration with the Manitoba College of Social Workers; and,

Whereas both the Office of the Children’s Advocate and the Honourable Ted Hughes, author of the Phoenix Sinclair Inquiry Report consistently maintains that ALL social work practitioners in the Province of Manitoba must be registered with the Manitoba College of Social Workers; and,

Whereas given the critical role child welfare workers, in particular, provide with respect to skilled assessment and the planning and intervention for children in the care of Child and Family Service Agencies, it is incumbent upon the Province of Manitoba to ensure accountability for the profession by requiring all social work practitioners to be registered with the Manitoba College of Social Workers;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal Government will ensure that all social work practitioners in the Province of Manitoba must be registered with the Manitoba College of Social Workers.

Whereas there is an acute shortage of Doctors of Psychology; and,

Whereas earlier diagnosis and treatment can catch and treat mental illness and prevent people from spiraling into crisis; and,

Whereas psychological services combined with medication is known to be more effective than medication alone;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal Government would fund psychological services through Medicare, while increasing availability of services across the province.

Whereas despite these guarantees, French language, culture and education were suppressed for decades in Manitoba; and,

Whereas the French fact in Manitoba continues to be a vital and dynamic element of our province that makes us unique and special as a province;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal Government will restore BEF, a bilingual assistant deputy minister of education and invest in francophone services and education.

6.0 Community Safety

6.1 Addressing Crime

Whereas crime has risen sharply under the PC government, including property crime, violent crime and murders; and

Whereas the City of Winnipeg has been continually voted the most unsafe urban center in Canada, with crime increasing annually in every neighborhood in Winnipeg; and;

Whereas Winnipeg holds the dubious honour of being the violent crime capital of Canada, with a rate of 153.5 violent crimes per 100,000 people; and

Whereas the PC government has failed to take any preventive measures to warn Manitobans about the dangers of meth and other deadly drugs; and

Whereas the PC government has cut, dismantled and undermined community programs that prevent crime;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal Government will support municipalities in employing Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CEPTED) programs, and work with Manitoba Hydro to improve community lighting; and,

Be It Hereby Further Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal Government would fund anti-crime and anti-gang community safety programs, and anti-drug campaigns in the public and in schools, and create drug stabilization units in Winnipeg, Brandon and across the province.

8.1 Good Jobs & A “Jobs Guarantee” Pilot Project

Whereas it has become more and more difficult for Manitobans to find full-time work with benefit; and,

Whereas more than 50% of working aged Canadians are employed in part-time jobs; and,

Whereas precarious or “insecure” work, where people have to work several jobs at once should be recognized as a serious problem, and not as “the new normal”; and,

Whereas worldwide, the single most important thing for most people is a “good job” - 30 hours or more a week with decent pay and benefits; and,

Whereas precarious and insecure work is making wage growth and inequality worse; and,

Whereas people who find themselves without work may lose their skills;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal Government will launch a “job guarantee program” where people without work can earn a living wage with benefits for work in the public interest, based on their own skills and abilities.

Whereas the welfare payment rates in Manitoba are the lowest in Canada and were lower in 2016 than they were in 1986; and,

Whereas current EIA means people can be cut off benefits if they work;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal Government will change the mandate of employment assistance from "getting people off the system" to "lifting people out of poverty," and reform EIA's rates and programs to reflect that mandate.

9.0 Matching Federal Funds

9.1 Ensuring that Manitoba Accesses Federal Funding Opportunities

Whereas the PC government of Brian Pallister has refused to engage positively with the Federal Government on areas of critical interest to Manitobans; and,

Whereas the Pallister Government has refused to sign funding agreements on housing, health, the environment, cannabis revenue sharing and more; and,

Whereas when the Pallister Government has signed agreements for matching funding, they have routinely failed to submit any plans or projects for funding; and,

Whereas, as a result, the Pallister PC Government is leaving \$1.9-billion in Federal Funds on the table when there is a desperate need for investment in infrastructure and projects in Manitoba; and,

Whereas this has not resulted in a better deal for Manitobans, only months and years of squandered opportunity as Manitoba workers and businesses pay the price for the Pallister government's inability to get its act together;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal Government will make it a priority to double our money by matching Federal funds, prioritizing projects and investing for the benefit of all Manitobans.

10.0 Education Resolutions

10.1 K-12 Education Review

Whereas K-12 education in Manitoba does require a review; however, Manitobans need a review that will support Manitobans and work to improve education in this province; and,

Whereas a proper review involves the careful input by all stakeholders; transparency and upfront actions need to be part of the equation; and,

Whereas a new Manitoba Liberal Government will meet with all stakeholders to ensure the Education Review is completed properly; involving Teachers, teachers' union; and with input by all regions of Manitoba; and,

Whereas the P.C. Government has prematurely closed the Education Library Services Branch; this has eliminated the equitable access to services for students and educators in communities in and outside of Winnipeg; it has reduced access to resources to remote communities; and,

Whereas the P.C. Government has frozen public sector pay increases to public educators; while certain sectors (some have been allowed to have raises going against the core of this bill); this proposed Bill has never been passed; making this freeze unconstitutional, illegal, and negative to the economy in Manitoba;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a new Manitoba Liberal government will conduct a Comprehensive K-12 Education Review properly by involving input by all stakeholders; and,

Be It Hereby Further Resolved that a new Manitoba Liberal government will involve/consult with teachers and the teaching union (Manitoba Teaching Society); and,

Be It Hereby Further Resolved that a new Manitoba Liberal government will "Re-Open" the Education Library Services Branch providing educators with equitable access to teaching materials and resources.

10.2 Curriculum for Everyday Living Skills

Whereas the Liberal Party of Manitoba prefers a “families first” approach to social issues and that traditional nuclear families, extended families and voluntary families provide crucial support for childhood and juvenile development, and full participation of each individual in a democratic society; and,

Whereas the current Manitoba curriculum includes many elements of everyday living skills throughout the early, middle and senior years; and,

Whereas senior years students who do not take Essential Mathematics (approximately 40% of senior years students) have a limited or inconsistent exposure to everyday living skills such as understanding taxes, budgeting, interest rates and insurance; and,

Whereas typical everyday living skills are interwoven throughout the Manitoba curriculum, but there is no discernible approach to ensuring all students have a solid grounding in the everyday living skills needed to become well-functioning members of our Manitoba society;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal government will ensure that Everyday Living Skills for early, middle and senior years students will be recognizable and outcomes clearly identified and interwoven throughout all curricula; and,

Be It Hereby Further Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal government will ensure that Everyday Living Skills at the early, middle and senior years will include, at minimum, the following topics: basic child care, health and nutrition, citizenship and government services, household management, financial literacy, and career planning.

11.0 Cannabis Policy

11.1 Cannabis Revenue for Municipalities

Whereas when the Federal Government offered to split Cannabis revenues 50/50 with provinces, provinces disagreed, claiming that costs of the change required more funding; and,

Whereas one of the central purposes of the legalization of cannabis was to reduce the black market in cannabis, and deprive criminals and gangs of revenue; and,

Whereas the Federal Government amended the revenue sharing formula, to offer a further 25% to provinces, on the condition that that funding go to municipalities; and,

Whereas the PC Government has been collecting revenues but has refused to share it with municipalities; and,

Whereas Manitoba has among the highest prices for cannabis across Canada; and,

Whereas statistics show that the customers for legal cannabis in Manitoba skew to older groups; and,

Whereas the PC government has claimed there will be no revenue from cannabis, but has provided no evidence whatsoever for this claim; and,

Whereas MLLC has projected that it will have \$95-million in revenue from cannabis, a figure that does not include the other taxation revenues; and,

Whereas younger consumers may be purchasing lower-cost black market cannabis;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal Government will share 25% of the federal excise revenue with municipalities; and,

Be It Hereby Further Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal Government will review cannabis taxation to see whether lower prices will reduce the black market, and act according to the findings.

12.0 Women's Policy

12.1 Full Day Kindergarten and Improving Child Care

Whereas the employment gap between men and women is greater in cities with high daycare fees; and,

Whereas three quarters (75.8%) of those working part-time in 2015 were women and one-quarter of women reported caring for children as their reason for working part-time; and,

Whereas women represent 35 percent of managerial positions, 28 percent of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) graduates, 23 percent of STEM workers, 20 percent of small business owners, and 29 percent of elected officials, but they take on 64 percent of unpaid care work in the home and represent 80 percent of single parents; and,

Whereas advancing women's equality in Canada has the potential to add \$150 billion in incremental GDP in 2026, or a 0.6 percent increase to annual GDP growth. Manitoba stands to gain between 4.7 % percent each year; and,

Be It Hereby Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal Government will implement policy to Increase women's labour force participation rate; increase the number of hours women work; and raise women's productivity relative to that of men by adding more women to high-productivity sectors; and,

Be It Hereby Further Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal Government would endeavor to match child care demands and study the implementation of full day kindergarten.

12.2 Getting More Women Elected

Whereas women make up 50.1% of the total population of Manitoba, yet only have 24% representation in the legislature.

Whereas potential women candidates are 15 times more likely to be responsible for the child care in their homes — and six times more likely to shoulder the majority of housework;

Whereas women are much less likely to have others encourage them to run for office;

Whereas there is still stereotyping of women's roles and abilities; demonstrable media imbalances in the treatment of women politicians; and rampant sexist perceptions of women's conduct and behavior:

Be It Hereby Resolved that the Manitoba Liberal Party will put aside a portion of incoming donations to be distributed among woman-identified candidates from the Sharon Carstairs Fund and support events and policy put forward by the women's committee.

12.3 Equal Pay

Whereas the employment rate for women in Manitoba is 10% less than that for men; and,

Whereas women earn \$0.87 for every dollar earned by men, largely as a result of wage inequality between women and men within occupations; and,

Whereas across Canada, gender parity at all levels in the workplace "improves profitability, workplace culture and the economy as a whole," PwC noted in a study last year. It estimated that Canada would likely see \$105-billion in GDP growth if it closed the wage gap and boosted female work-force participation; and,

Whereas the government of Manitoba studied gender pay inequality in the 1980's yet made no effort to close the gap for Provincial Employees;

Be It Hereby Resolved that a Manitoba Liberal Government would study wage inequality in provincial departments and close the gap.

12.4 Gender-based and Interpersonal violence

Whereas gender-based violence involves the use and abuse of power and control over another person and is perpetrated against someone based on their gender identity, gender expression or perceived gender; and,

Whereas in 2014, women self-reported slightly more than 1.2 million violent victimization incidents, representing 56% of all violent incidents; and,

Whereas women have a 20% higher risk of being victimized than men; and,

Whereas indigenous women are more than three times as likely to report being a victim of spousal violence as non- Indigenous women; and,

Whereas gay, lesbian or bisexual individuals are three times more likely than heterosexuals to report experiencing violence; and,

Whereas transgender people are nearly twice as likely as cis-gender women to experience intimate partner violence in their lifetimes; and,

Whereas women living with physical and/or cognitive impairments are two to three times more likely to experience violence than women living without such impairments;

Be It Hereby Resolved that the Manitoba Liberal Party will push to introduce legislation to educate youth in the K – 12 system of the harms of interpersonal and gender-based violence; and,
