





On the next page are colored circles, in which each circle represents a different way to describe an object/item/event. Refer to the circles when you and your kiddo are describing the pictures ©



	Green: What category or group does it belong to? (furniture, holiday, clothing, animal, etc.)
	Blue: What do you do with it? What does it do? (kick it, eat it, cook with it, keeps your warm)
(3)	Eye: What does it look like? Talk about shape, size, color, and even texture. (soft, rough, small, round, etc)
	Brown: What is it made of or made from? (wood, leather, metal glass, etc.)
	Pink: What are its parts? (rubber, wood, lead = part of a pencil)
	White: Where would you see it? Where would you use it? (school, office, jungle, outerspace)
	Orange: What else do you know about it? Prior knowledge, fun facts, and even opinions! (it is sharp, it can cut you, only adults can use = things about a knife)
