Mental Health Support Opportunity

As some of you may know, Bradford and Craven are soon to become trailblazer areas for Mental Health Support Teams (MHSTs) within educational settings. The teams will offer evidence based interventions for mild to moderate mental health issues alongside established provision.

There will be two Mental Health Support Teams (one based in Bradford central and one in Craven) and there will be four Education Mental Health Practitioners (EMHPs) within each team. These EMHPs will be trained by the University of Sheffield for 12 months, starting January 2020 and there will be an opportunity for employment on successful completion of the training.

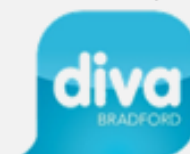

Child Exploitation Protocol

Bradford has launched a new [Child Exploitation Protocol](#) and [Risk Assessment Tool](#). This is now live and being used by multi-agencies working in the Front Door teams to respond to concerns about children potentially at risk of all forms of exploitation. Engagement events are planned in the near future to enable professionals to understand how this protocol and risk assessment tool will be used in practice: Young Lives will keep you informed.

The 'Looking out for our neighbours' campaign is back to help prevent loneliness and social isolation across West Yorkshire and Harrogate this winter.

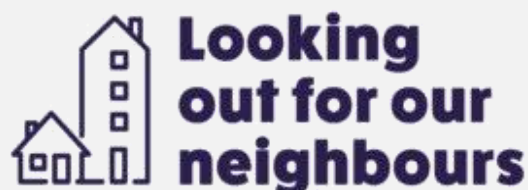

Independent Custody Visiting Scheme - 'A Volunteering Opportunity like No Other'

- Are you interested in what goes on behind the scenes in police custody?
- Do you have a flair for bringing people together to make a positive difference?
- Do you want to participate in a unique volunteering experience?

West Yorkshire's Police and Crime Commissioner, Mark Burns-Williamson is looking for community focused, compassionate volunteers to join his Independent Custody Visitor (ICV) scheme. When a person is arrested by the police, they are taken to a custody suite where they are detained whilst the details of the case are investigated. To promote transparency, and provide reassurance to communities about the treatment of detainees, an Independent Custody Visiting scheme is in place.

ICVs are volunteers, over the age of 18, from a variety of backgrounds and different communities, all whom live or work within West Yorkshire and who have broadly based interests in the local community. ICVs can enter a custody suite unannounced, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, and are expected to make at least 24 visits spread evenly over a 12 month period. Custody Visitors have an independent role, checking that people held in police custody (not yet convicted of any offence) are being properly treated. Issues raised by ICVs are dealt with anonymously by the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner, and are taken up directly with West Yorkshire Police.

Cascading leadership - free development opportunity for third sector leaders

Cascading Leadership provides an invaluable **free** opportunity for leaders working in health and wellbeing organisations in the voluntary and community sector in the UK to develop their leadership skills and receive practical support.

It is built on a peer-to-peer model where an experienced VCS leader (a consultant) supports another VCS leader who is seeking support (a partner). Consultants and partners are matched together in pairs. They meet at least five times over a period of nine months where the partner has an opportunity to work through organisational issues and receive support. The consultant also benefits from being stretched to develop their own leadership and skills, while being supported and supervised by senior staff at The King's Fund. There is no charge for the programme, which is valued at £5,800 for each pair.

The next course starts **March 2020**.

Applications are especially welcomed for consultants and partners from Black and minority ethnic communities, as people from these groups have been underrepresented on previous courses.
