Grants of £200,000 to £400,000 for charities and not-for-profit organisations delivering, or planning to deliver, Housing First services.

Energy Industry Voluntary Redress Scheme grants round 5.



#### Kindness, Engagement and Place

The Carnegie UK Trust has recently published a survey of attitudes towards kindness. Amongst their findings, based on a survey of 1253 adults, they have asked questions about how people engage with their local community. There is some really interesting information about how people engage.

The survey finds in England, for example

- 17% of people were likely to volunteer- 15% attend a public meeting
- 17% are likely to contact an elected representative
- 22% are likely to make a complaint6% are likely to set up a community organisation

The report goes on to look at how this breaks down according to gender, race and social class, and also how England compares to Northern Ireland, Scotland and Wales. You can read more here
