### **Together West Yorkshire - survey**

'Together West Yorkshire' is a partnership project being funded by the Home Office Early Interventions Fund. It is a collaboration between the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner, West Yorkshire Police, District Community Safety Partnerships, Youth Offending Teams and the Prison Service, and aims to deliver early intervention projects, with the aim of preventing serious violence. Early intervention plays an important role in identifying those at risk of harm or offending.

As part of the project, they are mapping and profiling to identity the range and content of early interventions for children and young people across West Yorkshire, delivered by statutory organisations and third sector groups and organisations.

### **Complete the Infrastructure Support Survey today!!**

On behalf of Bradford District Infrastructure Partnership, we strongly urge every single one of you, whether you're a big organisation, a small organisation, use infrastructure support or not, to complete this <u>survey!</u>

The grant that supports the Community Action, CNet and Volunteer Centres services is due to end this year. The council are using this time to ensure that the services they commission are future-proof. There are two parts to this; firstly, an external consultant is being sought to interviews stakeholders and understand what may be needed in the future – we will update you about this in due course.

Secondly we are promoting this <u>survey</u> which asks you about services important to you and/or your organisation. There is room to suggest other services that might not be currently provided. The <u>survey</u> results will be given to the consultant to add to the work and investigations to help form the new grant arrangements for sector support.

The results will also be shared with the sector via Briefing Bradford. The survey is only open for another 2 weeks. There will be a prize draw at the end of the survey for all completed forms, with the winner receiving a free place on a future training course of their choice, provided by Community Action. To be in the prize draw make sure you leave your name and organisation in the section at the end.

### **FUNDING**

### Important changes to bfunded

Access to the <u>bfunded 4 community</u> portal (where you search a national database) will close on 28 February 2019. This is due to funding cuts and increased costs to subscribe to the site.. On behalf of the bfunded partnership, thank you to everyone for using the service over the past 15 years.

However, all other bfunded website services including funding news, events, and advice information remain unchanges, and yes, we will still be sending you local funding opportunities as normal. And there are also no changes to voluntary organisation support services so groups in Bradford can still get help with funding advice, governance and more.

### Where can I search for national funding?

The nearest free open access online funding search is now the Idox funding portal for Leeds - <u>search for funding</u>. You do not need to register or subscribe to access the service.

Other options include <u>Funding Central</u> which is a subscription only service run by NCVO. Free access is available for groups with an annual income below £100,000. If your group's income is over £100,000 then the portal costs £100 plus VAT for an annual subscription.

### The Bright Ideas Fund!

The Community Business <u>Bright Ideas</u> <u>Fund</u> is now open! It is open until Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> April 2019.

Funded by <u>Power to Change</u>, the £3.2m Bright Ideas fund offers tailored support and grants of up to £15,000 to develop their projects.

The fund gives community groups the early stage finance they need to carry out consultations with local people to develop a community business idea the community wants and needs, and will also give them support and tools to start setting up their businesses. The funding programme is delivered by Locality, in partnership with Cooperatives UK, the Plunkett Foundation and Groundwork UK.

### Tudor Trust An Insight into one of the larger national funders

The <u>Tudor Trust</u> recently visited Bradford, with the aim of visiting groups in the area and getting to know more about the district and the challenges faced.

They fund about 8-10 local projects in the district, also distributing around £17-19 million to about 320 groups nationally; as they receive roughly 3000 applications each year, this means 1 in 10 is successful.

Some tops for applying:

- Look carefully at who they have funded in the past for clues to what they are looking for. Please look at the <u>2017-2018 grant report</u> for this information.
- The application process is 2 A4 pages about your project and what you do, key questions are, what difference do you want to make?; tell us about the community you work for and the challenges it faces; what strengths and opportunities do you see in your community; and how can Tudor Trust best help you.

The Kitemark is a certificate awarded to organisations that show their volunteering programmes provide the best experience possible for volunteers. In addition, it benchmarks the quality of your volunteer management and involvement, proves and improves the effectiveness of your work with volunteers and enhances your organisation's reputation. It is valid for two years, after which an organisation needs to apply again.

#### Why should my organisation apply?

The kitemark is recognised by the Bradford District Local Strategic Partnership and the Volunteer Centres and shows that your organisation manages a volunteering programme where volunteers receive a high quality, positive volunteering experience. The Volunteer Centres in Bradford and Keighley promote this Kitemark, helping volunteers to make informed choices about which organisation to apply to. It is based on the principles in the Bradford District Compact and the Bradford District Good Practice Statement on Volunteering.

#### How much does the Kitemark cost?

The Kitemark is awarded free to community organisations.

### **COMMUNITY SHOWCASE**

Real Safeguarding Stories is a video resource for safeguarding professionals and the wider community where survivors' stories are central to tackling abuse in society.

### Tell us about your organisation – who are you?

Real Safeguarding Stories is a partnership between Bradford Council and Collingwood Learning. They have over 30 survivor-based video monologues, told by actors, covering many forms of abuse including domestic abuse, scams, child sexual exploitation and more. These free videos can be used by anyone to raise awareness in the communities they live and work in, or for more formal professional training.

The partnership is about making survivors' stories central to improving safeguarding locally and nationally. You might be a concerned parent a teacher, community leader or a public sector professional looking to raise awareness of these important issues in a powerful way. Whoever you are, please use the site and share it with others. The success has been fantastic and we are getting around 1000 users a month on average, but we need to grow the project to ensure we are sustainable long term.

### Why was the organisation founded?

Collingwood Learning and Bradford Council had been working together for approximately 9 years. 5 years ago, Collingwood learning were asked to make some domestic violence themed videos as part of a live event for elected members. We interviewed survivors of abuse to contribute their stories which were particularly powerful. These stories became incredibly popular in safeguarding training across the region and beyond, which made us think about the need for more resources of a similar nature.

After much discussion we decided to make the video bank free to use, as it is so important that these resources can be used by anyone, often in the charitable, voluntary, and public sectors where budgets are so limited, but the biggest difference can be made.

### How has that aim changed if at all?

Now that we have made so many videos, with the help of survivors, charities, safeguarding practitioners, and agency partners across Bradford, we are even more committed to using these powerful stories to help keep people safe from abuse. We are also delighted with the positive impact it has made on the survivors who have shared their experiences with us.

To ensure our sustainability we are forming a Community Interest Company which will help us secure funding; delivering live performances of the stories at events; and seeking a long-term sponsor who can continue this brilliant journey with us.

### **COMMUNITY SHOWCASE**

### What are you most proud of about your organisation?

Were most proud of the feedback from Real Safeguarding Stories users about the impact the stories have had on audiences and how they open up discussion and allow people to explore the issues raised. We also hadn't anticipated the effect they would have on the survivors who had contributed and how it motivated them to go on and tell their real stories in other public forums. The videos are used in community centres, schools, universities, healthcare, social care, the police and many more forums and each piece of feedback is gold dust.
