# Free Flu Vaccination for frontline voluntary services staff

Once again Bradford council are also offering a voucher for a free flu vaccination to staff working in frontline voluntary services.

Flu can be a very serious condition. Outbreaks of flu can occur in health and social care settings, and because flu can be easily passed on, staff and residents are both at risk of infection. The flu vaccine will help protect you, your colleagues and the people that you care for.

#### Process for obtaining the Flu Vaccination

Frontline staff who do not qualify for the NHS flu vaccination scheme, but who have direct contact with vulnerable people may still be eligible to receive the flu vaccine FREE of charge. This is through the Public Health voucher scheme. Staff should request a flu voucher via their service manager, who should in turn contact Azar Hussain by e-mail for the voucher: <u>a.hussain@bradford.gov.uk</u>. Vouchers can be redeemed at participating community pharmacies. Vouchers are issued on a first come first served basis.



## Are you Young Carer Aware?

<u>Young Carer Aware</u> provides everyone with a practical understanding of young carers and their needs. It signposts all the sources of support that are available to help them enjoy a happy, fulfilling childhood.

The Young Carer Aware online training course is made up of four bite-sized sections:

- Young but not care free: Defines "young carer" and provides key facts and figures on young carers and the work they do.
- Legislation and children's rights Introduces the rights of children and the legislation in place to protect young carers.
- Meeting the needs of young carers Explores the problems young carers can face and the services available to support them.
- Testing your knowledge Mastery test to verify each user's knowledge and understanding of the contents of the course. On successfully passing the test, users can download a personal course completion certificate.

## Stand Out in a Global Market

Stand Out in a Global Market is back in Leeds on 25th October 2019! Organised by Euroguidance UK, the event will inspire young people to kick-start their careers by gaining experience abroad. This free one-day event is open to all young people aged 16-18 and will introduce attendees to the range of international opportunities open to them.

## Spending round 2020-21

The Chancellor Sajid Javid delivered the government's budget for next year.

Key things to note for organisations working with children and young people:

- Over £700 million to support children and young people with special educational needs next year – an 11% increase compared to last year
- An additional £1 billion for adult and children's social care
- Continued funding of the Troubled Families programme (known as Families First in Bradford)
- Plans for a Youth Investment Fund

Criminals are <u>targeting young people</u> via social media to be 'money mules', according to Santander. "It takes just a few clicks to become embroiled in this type of crime, but the consequences can have a lifelong effect."

## The cost of a child in 2019

Child Poverty Action Group has published its <u>annual index</u> on how much it costs to raise a child. This is now £185,000 for lone parents (up 19% since 2012) and £151,000 for couples (up 5.5% since 2012).

#### Go Higher

Go Higher West Yorkshire will again be providing grants to community groups for activities that will help more young people aged 13 to 19 progress into higher education from areas where rates of progression are currently low.

This was something that Young Lives encouraged Go Higher to introduce and we know Bradford groups were successful last year. Leeds Community Foundation are doing a <u>briefing event</u> on 3 October.

Alongside this qualification you will undertake an employability course. Progression from this course could be onto a Level 1 Childcare course and into voluntary work.

Further development opportunities: Once you have completed these two levels and gained 140 hours of voluntary or paid work, you should be able to progress onto a Level 2 in Childcare, which is the industry recognised qualification to enable you to take your first steps into employment. You will however need to maintain a minimum of 14 hours a week either paid or voluntary.
